HOW TO USE CLEARWATER

The CLEARWATER tablets are hard and dissolve slowly in water. The proper way to spread the tablets is to beadcast them with a fanning motion of the hand over the surface of the water, similar to the way grass seed is sown.

8 to 21 lbs. per 1,000 square feet of surface in average weed density. Applications of 4 lbs. per 1,000 square feet of surface may be needed in areas of high weed density. Use the same quantities when spraying in early spring control.

LEAKWATER R is intended to control the following common lake weeds: arrowhead, bladderwort, crowfoot, duckweed, curly watercress, Elodea or Anacharis, waterchestnut, water-milfoil, water-lettuce, and water-mat.

Treatment of aquatic weeds can result in oxygen loss from decomposition of dead weeds. This loss can cause fish suffocation. Therefore, to minimize this hazard treat 1/4 to 1/3 of the water area in a single treatment and repeat 10 to 14 days between treatments. Begin treatment along the shore and proceed inward to avoid spreading the first spray into untreated areas.
