

DIRECTIONS FOR USING QUIGG'S BLEACH

FOR WHITENING BLEACHES CLOTHES WHITE

Wash clothes as usual and rinse once. Then add one tablespoonful of QUIGG'S bleach to each gallon of your second rinse water, stir thoroughly, and then immerse the articles to be bleached in the rinse water for ten minutes. Then rinse several times. Use only on white and fast color linen and cotton goods. Do not use on silk and/or wool.

FOR REMOVING STAINS INK COFFEE FRUIT TEA GRASS MILDEW SCORCH ETC

Use only on white or color-fast cottons or linens (do not use on silk or wool). Soak in cold water for 10 to 15 minutes and then wash out any starch or dressing and rinse. Add two tablespoonfuls of QUIGG'S bleach to each quart of cold water, mix thoroughly, and immerse article completely for 10 to 15 minutes. Rinse well in clear water. For scorch same as above. Any trace of scorch remaining usually disappears when fabric is dried in the sunlight. Repeat process if necessary. After removing some inks by the above method, the remaining rust spots can be removed with lemon juice or vinegar. Then rinse thoroughly in clear water.

FOR DEODORIZING SERVES MANY HOUSEHOLD NEEDS

For sanitary ware, metal, enameled metal, and vitrified cooking utensils, crockery, dishes and glassware, wood-ware, thermos bottles, fruit jars, shower floors and linoleum, wash thoroughly the entire surface with a good detergent and water and when clean rinse thoroughly with clear water. Then apply a solution of three tablespoonfuls of QUIGG'S bleach to each quart of cold water. Make sure entire surface is immersed for 5 minutes. Rinse with potable water.

CAUTIONS

If taken internally, feed bread soaked in milk. Call physician. Harmful if swallowed. Skin contact may cause severe irritation. Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Rinse immediately. Call physician.

DO NOT USE ON SILK, WOOL, or ACETATE
Keep upright in cool place, tightly capped. Do not use with other household chemicals such as Ammonia or Bowl Cleansers.
