The proposed amendment to the registration of the product cited above, changing the declaration of petroleum distillate from active to inert and bringing the label into compliance with FR Notice 87-8, is acceptable subject to the comments listed below. A stamped copy of the draft label is enclosed for your records. Submit five (5) copies of the finished printed label before the product is released for shipment under the revised label.

1. Since FR Notice 87-8 has been withdrawn you may wish to revert back to the physical and chemical hazard statements used prior to FR Notice 87-8.
2. Submit a corrected/updated Confidential Statement of Formula (CSF). Refer to the guide for completing the CSF enclosed with our letter for EPA Registration No. 10807-140. Note that for the active ingredients the percentage declared on the label cannot be higher than the lower certified limit. Note: The lower certified limits on the current CSF do not conform with the label declaration.

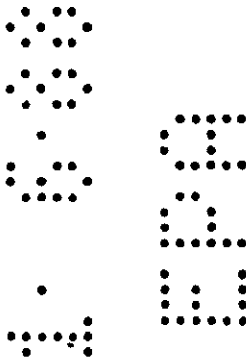

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DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

STORAGE & DISPOSAL

Storage: Store in a cool area away from heat or open flame.
Disposal: Do not reuse empty container. Wrap container and put in trash collection.
FOR USE IN AUTOMATIC DISPENSERS: One dispenser unit should be installed for each 8,000 cubic feet of space to be treated. The dispenser activates the 54 mg. valve once every 15 minutes. After two hours of operation enough insecticide is suspended in the air to kill a substantial proportion of the flies, mosquitoes and gnats present. Usually the effectiveness will be noticeable within one hour after the dispenser is activated. If less than 24 hour control is required, the dispenser should be set to start one hour before control is desired and run one hour after control is no longer needed. Keep in mind that such factors as air flow rate, size of space treated, humidity and room temperatures all affect insect activity and control. Therefore, one unit per 8,000 cubic feet should be considered as an average need with adjustments made depending on specific conditions at place of usage. As with any method of insect control, best results are achieved when sanitation and other positive insect prevention practices are followed.

This 8 1/2 oz. can of insect killer contains approximately 3,400 "shots" sufficient to sustain operation for a total of 850 hours (35 days on around-the-clock basis) or 70 days on a 12-hour basis. When used on a 24-hour basis, it is suggested that the container be changed once a month (once every 2 months on a 12-hour basis).

AUTOMATIC DISPENSER: Concentrated Aerosol Insect Killer contains a highly effective insecticide formulation specifically designed for use in automatic mist dispensing units around food handling establishments, food processing establishments, restrooms, dining rooms and restaurants where flies, gnats, flying moths, and mosquitoes are an annoyance.

HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

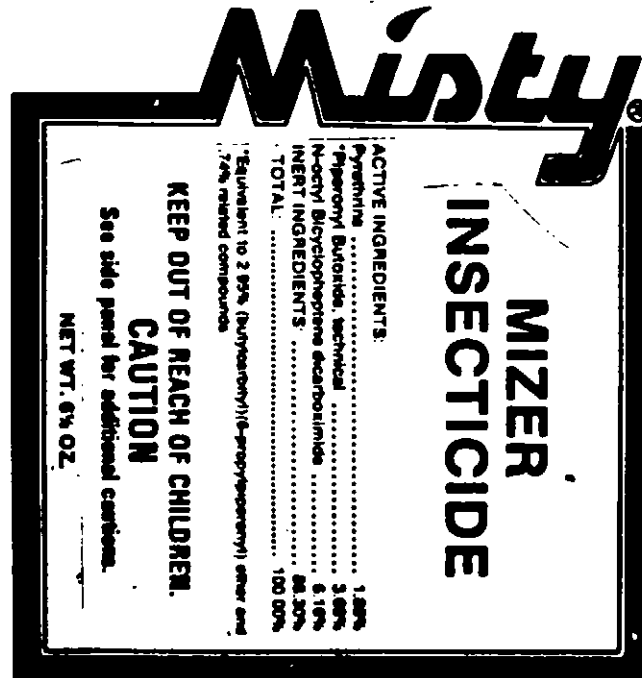
The active ingredients of this product are toxic to fish. Automatic dispensers should not be installed near fish tanks. Users may want to remove fish from treated rooms.
PHYSICAL OR CHEMICAL HAZARDS: EXTREMELY FLAMMABLE. Do not use or store near fire, sparks or heated surfaces. Turn off pilot lights in gas appliances and unplug or turn off electrical equipment in the use area. After airing out phase is completed, relight pilot lights and reconnect electrical current. Do not smoke in the use area. Contents under pressure. Do not puncture or incinerate container. Exposure to temperatures above 130° F may cause bursting. Incineration of container may cause explosion.

CAUTION: Do not use in nurseries or rooms where infants, ill or aged persons are confined. Food, food contact surfaces and utensils should be protected from exposure to the spray or washed with an effective cleaning compound followed by a potable water rinse before reuse. Large drafts of forced ventilation may reduce or eliminate the insecticidal efficacy of these installations.
