ROOTOUT is an easy, remarkable, inexpensive chemical means of killing Fungus, Slime and roots. ROOTOUT is time tested after 13 years of successful use.

The roots of trees and shrubs in their search for food and water penetrate and clog conduits, sanitary sewers and storm drains. ROOTOUT when used as directed is then absorbed into the roots which are killed and are eventually decomposed and washed away leaving drains and sewers open.

HOW MUCH ROOTOUT TO USE

PREVENTIVE TREATMENTS: 2 lbs. semi-annually (spring and fall) will help keep sewer lines open, free flowing.

PARTIAL STOPPAGE: usually corrected with one application of 2 to 4 lbs.

COMPLETE STOPPAGE: requires 6 lbs. at one time or 4 lbs. weekly for 2 or 3 weeks. The line must be partially opened by use of a sewer rod to allow flow of ROOTOUT. ROOTOUT's action clears most stoppages but immediate results should not be expected as some time is required to kill the root, following treatment.

DIRECTIONS

ROOTOUT has been used successfully by thousands of satisfied users. ROOTOUT is recommended for use in lines leading to cesspools and septic tanks. It is important to follow the Directions carefully.

For House Pipe Lines

Pour contents of ROOTOUT into toilet bowl nearest to sewer line, 1 lb. at a time. Flush for each 1 lb. so crystals will be carried to obstruction in lines leading to sewer. It's best to apply ROOTOUT late in the evening before retiring when waste facilities are not being used. NEVER POUR IN TO SINK OR TUB DRAINS.

For Storm Drains

Empty 2 lb. box of ROOTOUT and use water hose to carry crystals to obstruction.

For Slime and Fungi in Sewer Pumps

Slime and fungi are contributing causes of odors and pump trouble. Pour 2 lbs. of ROOTOUT into cloth bag and place in inlet of storage well.
