Dear Ms. Zajac:

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable with the following provision(s):

First Aid section comment(s):

1. Insert the following text as a 2nd sentence in the 5th row of the First Aid section (table): "For additional information on this pesticide product (including health concerns, medical emergencies or pesticide incidents), you may call 1-800-xxx-xxxx and/or the National Pesticide Information Center at 1-800-858-7378."

Precautionary Statements, Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals subsection comment(s):

2. Replace the 5th sentence in this section with: "Wash hands thoroughly with plenty of soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco or using the toilet."

Storage and Disposal Statement section comment(s):

- Revise the line labeled as "Storage:" to read "Pesticide Storage:"
- 4. Revise the line labeled as "Disposal:" to read "Pesticide Disposal:"

5. Your company's full name and address must appear on this pesticide product label as per 40 CFR §156.10(c).

Sherman Williams should note that a notice of availability of EPA's reregistration eligibility decision (RED) document for products containing pyrethrins was published in the *Federal Register* on July 26, 2006 (Volume 71, Number 143, Pages 42387-42389). In addition, EPA's RED for products containing piperonyl butoxide was published in the *Federal Register* on July 26, 2006 (Volume 71, Number 143, Pages 42385-42386). As a result, additional data and/or labeling changes may be required for products containing pyrethrins and/or piperonyl butoxide.

A copy of your label stamped "Accepted with Comments" is enclosed for your records. Please submit two (2) copies of the final printed labeling, incorporating the above changes, before releasing the product for shipment. If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product bearing amended labeling constitutes accepting of these conditions.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS Hazards To Humans & Domestic Animals

CAUTION: Harmful if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through skin. Avoid contact with skin, eyes or clothing. Avoid breathing vapor or spray mist. Causes moderate eye irritation. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, chewing gum or using tobacco and going to the toilet. Remove contaminated clothing and wash before reuse.

Physical or Chemical Hazards

Contents under pressure. Do not use or store near heat or open flame. Do not puncture or incinerate container. Exposure to temperatures above 130°F may cause bursting.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

SHAKE BEFORE USING AND AT INTERVALS DURING PROLONGED USE.

Vacate premises after treatment and ventilate before reoccupying. Avoid contamination of feed and foodstuffs. When using this product in food processing plants, cover or remove food during treatment. Cover all food processing surfaces during treatment or thoroughly clean before using. When using this product in these areas, apply only when facility is not in operation. Remove pets, birds and cover fish aquariums before spraying. Do not allow dogs or cats to re-enter treated areas until spray deposits have dried. This product should not be used to control lice on humans. A physician should be consulted to obtain suitable treatment.

Hold container upright with nozzle away from you. Press valve down and spray as directed. To avoid possible staining of fabrics or surfaces, do not spray at close range.

FLIES, MOSQUITOES, GNATS, WASPS AND FLYING MOTHS (MILLERS): Close all doors and windows and spray room at the rate of 1 second per 1000 cubic feet. Direct spray to all parts of the room, especially windows and other light sources which attract these insects. Keep nozzle in constant motion. Keep room closed for 10 to 15 minutes after treatment.

ROACHES, WATERBUGS, SILVERFISH, CRICKETS, SPIDERS, CENTIPEDES AND SOW BUGS: Spray into hiding places such as cracks and crevices, behind sinks, cabinets, along baseboards and floors, around drains and plumbing, hitting insects with spray whenever possible.

ANTS: Spray trails, nests and points of entry. Spray on ants where possible.

INDIAN MEAL MOTHS AND ANGOUMOIS GRAIN MOTHS: Close doors and windows. Direct spray into all parts of room especially around stored food product containers, pallets and darkened areas. Spray 7 to 10 seconds for each 1000 cubic feet of space. Keep area closed for 15 minutes following treatment.

CARPET BEETLES: Spray directly on beetles, baseboards, floors, shelves and carpets. Spray into cracks and crevices, processing and handling equipment, around cartons or containers and other areas where these insects tend to congregate. Spray 30 seconds for each 100 square feet of surface. Keep area closed for 45 minutes to 1 hour after treatment.

CONFUSED FLOUR BEETLES, SAW-TOOTHED GRAIN BEETLES, GRANARY WEEVILS, RICE WEEVILS, RED FLOUR BEETLES, GRAIN MITES: Spray into cracks and crevices, processing and handling equipment, around cartons or containers and other areas where these insects tend to congregate. Spray 30 seconds for each 100 square feet of surface. Keep area closed for 45 minutes to 1 hour after treatment.

LICE: Spray on garments, bedding, mattresses; furniture, floors, carpeting and inanimate surfaces. First spray an inconspicuous area to test for possible staining or discoloration. Inspect after drying, then proceed a to spray entire area to be treated. Hold can upright with nozzle away from you. Press button and spray surface to be treated from a distance of 10 inches. Spray each square foot for 3 seconds, directing spray into all infested surfaces until moist.

FOR BEDDING: Make sure spray is directed into corners of fitted sheets and blankets as well as inside and outside of pillow cases. In the case of garments and headgear, close attention should be given to seams, hems, cuffs, collars, and creases. After treatment, bedding and all garments must be either laundered in het awater or dry cleaned as required.

For mattresses, furniture and carpeting: Direct spray into all folds, tucks, seams and crevices of infested

areas until moist. Allow all treated surfaces to dry completely before use.

BEDBUGS: Spray mattresses, particularly around tufts and seams. Take beds apart and spray into all joints. Treat baseboards, moldings and frames.

FLEAS: Spray sleeping quarters, bedding, floor and floor covering where pets are kept. Repeat as necessary. Use only a recommended pet spray on pets.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse or refill this container.

Storage: Do not store near heat or open flame. Store in a cool dry area away from children. [Store in a cool dry area away from [inaccessible to] children and pets and away from heat or open flame.] [Do not transport or store below 32°F.] [Protect from freezing.] [Do not freeze.]

Disposal: Do Not Incinerate Or Puncture! If empty: Place in trash or offer for recycling if available. [This container may be recycled in aerosol recycling centers. At present, there are only a few such centers in the country.
