On the basis of information furnished by the registrant, the above named pesticide is hereby Registered/Reregistered under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act.

A copy of the labeling accepted in connection with this Registration/Reregistration is returned herewith.

In order to protect health and the environment, the Administrator, on his motion, may at any time suspend or cancel the registration of a pesticide in accordance with the Act. The acceptance of any name in connection with the registration of a product under this Act is not to be construed as giving the registrant a right to exclusive use of the name or to its use if it has been covered by others.

This product is conditionally registered in accordance with Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act section 3(c)(7)(C) provided that you:

1. Submit/cite all data or other material required for registration or reregistration of your product under Title section 3(c)(5) of the Act, as well as the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.

2. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment:

- a. Add the phrase "EPA Registration No. 10951-5."
- b. The Agency's definition of "wetlands" has recently been updated to include "areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark". Accordingly, your present label statement,

Do not apply directly to water or wetlands  
 (i.e., swamps, bogs, marshes and potholes)

- c. Either delete the heading, "Small grains" or remove the crops corn, rice and sorghum from this grouping and place them elsewhere on your label.
  - d. The terms "ACTIVE INGREDIENTS" and "INERT INGREDIENTS" must be aligned to the same margin in your ingredient statement.
  - e. Delete the following crops and uses: squash, melons, barley, rye, and all indoor uses (in buildings and agricultural premises). Refer to the enclosed copy of the March 18, 1991 *Federal Register* notice which announced that these crops and uses were not being supported for the reregistration of malathion.
3. Submit the 1-year storage stability data within 15 months from the date of this Registration notice.
4. Submit five (5) copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment. Refer to the A-79 enclosure for a further description of final printed labeling.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

RECOMMENDATIONS

**ALFALFA:** Alfalfa Weevil larvae, Aphids, Armyworms, Grasshoppers, Lygus Bugs, Spider Mites - Use 1 to 1 1/4 pints per acre. Can be used same day as harvest.

**COTTON:** Aphids, Lygus Bugs, Thrips - Use 1 to 1 1/2 pints per acre.

**BEANS:** Aphids, Cucumber Beetles, Spider Mites, Lygus Bugs - Use 1 1/2 pints per acre. DO NOT apply within 1 day of harvest.

**CUCUMBER, SQUASH, MELONS:** Aphids, Cucumber Beetle, Cutworms, Hoppers, Thrips - Use 1 3/4 pints per acre. DO NOT apply within 3 days of harvest.

**LETTUCE:** Aphids, Cabbage Looper, Leafhoppers - Use 2 pints per acre. DO NOT apply within 14 days of harvest on leaf lettuce, and 7 days of harvest on head lettuce.

**SAFFLOWER:** Aphids, Lygus Bugs, Grasshoppers - Use 1 1/4 pints per acre. DO NOT apply within 3 days of harvest.

**TOMATOES:** Aphids, Spider Mites - Use 1/4 pint per acre. DO NOT apply within 1 day of harvest.

**SMALL GRAINS:** (Barley, Corn, Rice, Rye, Sorghum & Wheat): Aphids, Armyworms - Use 1 1/4 pints per acre. DO NOT apply within 7 days of harvest.

FLY CONTROL

Use at the rate of 1 gallon in 80 gallons of water and apply at the rate of 1 gallon of spray per 1,000 square feet on painted surfaces and 2 gallons per 1,000 square feet on unpainted surfaces in and around buildings which house domestic animals, around yards, and around homes. Repeat as necessary. For Bait Spray, add 1 gallon unsulfurized molasses or corn syrup or 10 pounds of sugar to the above mixture. If fly population is severe, use at the rate of 1 1/2 gallons and 20 pounds of sugar in 80 gallons of water. Avoid contamination of food, utensils, milk, milk equipment and water. Do Not use on white-washed surfaces until 14 days after white-wash application. For greater effectiveness in fly control in and around buildings which house domestic animals, and other agricultural premises, the fly breeding sites such as manure and other waste materials should be eliminated. DO NOT USE in dwellings. Remove animals from buildings and around yards and homes before spraying.

HAZARD TO HUMANS & DOMESTIC ANIMALS

CAUTION

Written or oral warnings must be given to workers who are expected to be in a treated area or in an area about to be treated with this product. When oral warnings are given, warnings shall be given in a language customarily understood by workers. Oral warnings must be given if there is reason to believe that written warnings cannot be understood by workers. Oral and written warnings must include the following information: "CAUTION. Area treated with Malathion on (Date of Application). Do not enter without appropriate protective clothing until sprays have dried. In case of accidental exposure, see Statement of Practical Treatment."

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Pesticide Storage

Do not store below 0°F. (-15°C).

Do not use or store near heat, open flame or hot surfaces.

Keep out of reach of children and animals. Store in original containers only. Store in a cool, dry place and avoid excess heat. Carefully open containers. After partial use, replace lids and close tightly. Do not put concentrate or dilute material into food or drink containers. Do not contaminate other pesticides, fertilizers, water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

In case of spill, avoid contact, isolate area and keep out animals and unprotected persons. Confine spills.

To confine spill: If liquid, dike surrounding area or absorb with sand, cat litter or commercial clay. If dry material, cover to prevent dispersal. Place damaged package in a holding container. Identify contents.

Pesticide Disposal
