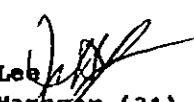
The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act is acceptable provided that you:

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with the label.

BAF-60 is used to inhibit the growth of algae, bacteria, and fungi in recirculating and industrial cooling water systems. Before treatment with BAF-60, systems should be cleaned to remove algal growth, microbiological slimes, and other deposits. Systems should be treated with an initial slug addition of 8.9 to 13.9 fluid ounces of BAF-60 per 1000 gallons of water in the system. Repeat the initial dosage until control is evident. Subsequent slug additions of 2.3 to 13.9 fluid ounces of BAF-60 per 1000 gallons of water every 1 to 5 days or as needed. The required frequency of treatment depends on the amount of bleed-off and the severity of the microbiological problem. Slug additions should be made to the sump of water cooling towers.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal. **STORAGE:** Do not expose to extreme temperatures. Do not stack more than 10 drums. Drums should be opened in well-ventilated areas. Leaking or damaged drums should be placed in overpack drums for disposal. Spills should be absorbed in sawdust or other inert material and disposed of in a sanitary landfill. Keep container closed when not in use. **PESTICIDE DISPOSAL:** Pesticide wastes are toxic. Improper disposal of pesticide wastes is a violation of Federal Law.
