

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

DIRECTIONS FOR SWIMMING POOL USE:

ICD Calcium Hypochlorite Granular Dry Chlorine is a concentrated chlorine agent in dry, free-flowing, non-dusting form. ICD Calcium Hypochlorite controls growth of algae and effectively kills many bacteria which may be the cause of infections. For initial chlorination of any pool water, add 1 ounce of ICD Calcium Hypochlorite for each 1,000 gallons. Subsequently add at least 3-4 ounces of ICD Calcium Hypochlorite daily or as needed for each 5,000 gallons of water whether the pool is in use or not. Maintaining 0.6-1.0 (parts per million) available chlorine residual and a 7.2-7.6 pH range will result in clean, sparkling water. To help you in maintaining the proper available chlorine residual, it is possible to increase the available chlorine residual in pool water by 1.0 (parts per million) by adding 1 ounce of ICD Calcium Hypochlorite for each 5,000 gallons of water. Use an orthotolidine test kit for available chlorine determinations. For best results, add ICD Calcium Hypochlorite as a solution (1 oz. in 2 qts. of water) to the pool water or scatter the granular material directly over the pool surface. ICD Calcium Hypochlorite can be added anytime, however, early evening is usually the preferred time if added only once a day.

WINTERIZING POOLS - While water is still clear & clean, apply 0.6 oz. of product per 1000 gallons, while filter is running, to obtain a 3 ppm available chlorine residual, as determined by a suitable test kit. Cover pool, prepare heater, filter and heater components for winter by following manufacturers' instructions.
