

1. The registration number which has been assigned to this product must appear on the label as EPA Registration No. 15596-12.
2. Revise the sentence "For heavily soiled equipment, a preliminary cleaning is required" to read "A preliminary cleaning is required for all equipment."
3. Revise "escherichia" to read "Escherichia."
4. Change "Probably" to "Probable."
5. The labels which will be used for this product in channels of trade must reflect these revisions.
6. Five copies of the finished printed labels, as defined in the A-79 enclosure, must be submitted to the Agency before the product is released for shipment to comply with PR Notice 82-2 of June 18, 1982.
7. The finished printed labels must comply with the general labeling requirements of Section 162.10 of Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations. If the label does not satisfy these requirements it will be rejected.

Sanitizing — To sanitize hard non-porous food
milk tanks and milking equipment, clean with
thoroughly, dilute 1 oz. of Troy 1641 in
