Purpose

The purpose of this submission is to revise your label in accordance with PR Notice 2001-1 according to our last letter, October 9, 2003.

Label review

The labeling submitted with the above letter, under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) is acceptable, provided you submit one (1) copy of final printed labeling to us, with the following change, before you ship your product.

- 1. Modify the reason under "RESTRICTED USE PESTICIDE" to "Due to Acute Avian Toxicity and Acute Oral Toxicity".
- 2. Revise the first sentence of your "Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals" text as follows: "Fatal if swallowed."
- 3. In your "First Aid" text, add the following after "IF SWALLOWED" and before "IF IN EYES":

If on skin or clothing

- •Take off contaminated clothing.
- •Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water

for 15-20 minutes.

•Call a poison control center, doctor, or 1-800-424-9300 immediately for treatment advice.

Existing stocks

Stocks of existing labels may be used for eighteen (18) months.

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Consequence for non-compliance

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

Storage: Store only in original container in a cool, dry ocation inaccessible to children and pets. Store apart from tood or animal feed and protect against rodent penetration of the carton. Store apart from other pesticides, fertilizers, food or feed that may cause cross-contamination of odor or insect infestation.

PREBAITING DIRECTIONS

This product must not be applied where nontarget birds are feeding. Careful observations of the birds' feeding habits must therefore be made to establish proper feeding locations and to determine that no nontarget birds are feeding on the prebait.

Prebaiting with bread is essential to the effective deterrence of birds with Avitrol. Tossing bread squares into the air sometimes attracts the birds. Bread tossed from a very slowly moving vehicle is often readily accepted. Bait can also be effectively broadcast by a person on foot. In this case it is desirable to wear the same hat and clothing each time. Immediately after the bait is applied, move away from the area. Early morning placement, before natural feeding occurs, is best. Continue prebaiting until the pest birds have established their feeding pattern.

BAIT PREPARATION

To prepare the bait, cut each of two (2) standard slices of fresh bread into 12 equal pieces. Open and place into the plastic bag in which a portion of the product purchased was shipped; close by twisting the top entrapping as much air as possible. Tumble and shake the contents until all the powder is evenly distributed over the pieces of bread with none remaining on the walls of the bag. Handle treated bait with a gloved hand and remove with soap and water any of the powder that may have adhered to the skin.

DILUTION DIRECTIONS

Prior to baiting, mix one part (24 squares) bread treated with Avitrol Concentrate with 10 additional parts (240 squares) of untreated bread of similar size. Use rubber glove if mixing is done by hand.

BAITING DIRECTIONS

To obtain minimal mortality, the distribution of Avitrol should be limited to scattered spot placements that will provide feeding opportunities only for the necessary number of target birds. After the birds' feeding pattern has been established through prebaiting, replace untreated bait with diluted treated bait only at sites where the target birds are actively feeding. Do not apply treated bait to inactive feeding sites. Where uneaten bait may be a hazard to other birds or animals, it should be picked up at the end of each day. Do not allow Avitrol treated bread to remain in unprotected places where it may be mistaken for food by people or animals. This product must not be applied where nontarget bird species are feeding. For each application of bait in flocks of over 5,000, broadcast the 264 bread squares (24 treated and 240 untreated) prepared from one bag of powder among eight widely separated sites. For flocks fewer than 5,000, use half of the above quantity. Repeat treatment until bird numbers have been reduced to acceptable levels on the premises. Note that retreatment may also be necessary after rainfall.
