The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under FIFRA Section 3(c)(7)(A), is acceptable, provided that you make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

1. Revise the diazinon declaration in the ingredients statement to read:

Diazinon [0,0-Diethyl 0-(2-isopropyl-6-methyl-4-pyrimidinyl) phosphorothioate]

2. We recommend the following revision to the "If Swallowed" advice:

If swallowed - Call a physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Drink one or two glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching the back of throat with a finger. Repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious or convulsing person.

3. We recommend expanding the "If on skin" advice to read:

If on skin - Remove contaminated clothing and wash affected areas immediately with soap and water.

4. In the "Hazards to Humans" section delete "or dust" since this product is a liquid. You may also delete "In case of contact, flush eyes with plenty of water" since the same advice appears in the Statement of Practical Treatment.

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5. Revise the Note to Physician to read:

Note to Physician - Product contains an organophosphate insecticide. If symptoms of cholinesterase inhibition are present, atropine by injection is antidotal. 2-PAH is also antidotal, and may be administered in conjunction with atropine.

6. Please submit in writing the flash point for your product. If it is over 150°F you may delete the heading Physical Hazards and associated text.
7. Add "Only" to the end of the limitation "An insecticide for formulating use" at the top of the front panel.
8. Add the heading DIRECTIONS FOR USE over "It is a violation of Federal law, etc."
9. Replace "Reformulators must be responsible for providing data to register product" with "Formulators using this product are responsible for obtaining EPA registration for their formulated products."
10. In November of 1973, your company submitted typewritten copies of technical sheets (bulletins) that were available to formulators upon request. The Agency indicated in a letter dated January 8, 1974, that you should refer to the available technical bulletin(s) on the label. Are such bulletins still available? Our typewritten copies were designated D.S.16.46.12 with reference to a formulation, components and instructions guide D.S.16.46.(20). If still available, you should refer formulators to them in the Directions for Use, e.g., "Refer to Technical Bulletin(s) \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_) for instructions for formulating and other information." If available, please submit 5 copies of the current technical bulletins so that they may be stamped and made a part of official registration record.

Submit five (5) copies of your revised final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment with the amended labeling.

A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.
