Product Recovery Program:

- (A) You will repurchase from retailers or formulators any unopened, original packages of diazinon end-use product formulated directly indirectly from any of your new diazinon outdoor nonagricultural use MUPs, and any unopened original packages of the new diazinon outdoor non-agricultural use MUPs that have not been sold or used by the retailer or formulator by December 31, 2004 ("Diazinon Inventory") who present to you reasonable documentation of the average net purchase price it paid to its supplier for the same product over the preceding 24 months, if the retailer or formulator will accept in payment an amount equal to the sum of 1) 100% of the documented average net price paid by the retailer or formulator to its supplier for the same product over the prior 24 month period; and 2) the cost to ship the product to a location designated by you. If a retailer has Diazinon Inventory after December 31, 2004 but cannot provide reasonable documentation of the price paid to its supplier for the same product over the prior 24 month period, you will pay 100% of the your best estimate of the average net wholesale price of the product in the United States plus the cost to ship the product to a location designated by you.
- (B) You must arrange to take delivery of Diazinon Inventory as soon as commercially practicable after December 31, 2004, but in no event may you take delivery later than 45 days after notification from any retailer or formulator holding Diazinon Inventory. You will make reasonable efforts to recover all Diazinon Inventory by March 31, 2005. You have the obligation in perpetuity to repurchase any Diazinon Inventory not already repurchased by March 31, 2005. You will repurchase and take delivery of any outstanding Diazinon Inventory within 45 days of your receiving notice of the existence of such outstanding Diazinon Inventory.
- 5. Reporting. You shall submit to EPA a list of the purchasers of your respective new diazinon outdoor non-agricultural use MUPs for each twelve month period beginning with the period January 1, 2001 to December 31, 2001 and ending with the period January 1, 2003 to December 31, 2003. You shall submit this list to EPA within thirty (30) calendar days of the conclusion of the preceding twelve month period.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.
