The amended label referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable. This approval does not affect any conditions that were previously imposed on this registration. You continue to be subject to existing conditions on your registration and any deadlines connected with them.

A stamped copy of your labeling is enclosed for your records. This labeling supersedes all previously accepted labeling. You must submit one copy of the final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment with the new labeling. In accordance with 40 CFR 152.130(c), you may distribute or sell this product under the previously approved labeling for 18 months from the date of this letter. After 18 months, you may only distribute or sell this product if it bears this new revised labeling or subsequently approved labeling. "To distribute or sell" is defined under FIFRA section 2(gg) and its implementing regulation at 40 CFR 152.3.

Should you wish to add/retain a reference to the company's website on your label, then please be aware that the website becomes labeling under the Federal Insecticide Fungicide and Rodenticide Act and is subject to review by the Agency. NOTE TO PHYSICIAN

No specific antidote is available. All treatments should be based on observed signs and symptoms of distress in the patient. Overexposure to materials other than this product may have occurred. This product contains petroleum distillates. If large amounts (greater than 1 ml/kg body weight) of the product have been ingested, the stomach should be evacuated by gastric intubation with aid of cuffed endotracheal tube to prevent aspiration of petroleum distillates. After removal of stomach contents, wash stomach by instilling 30 to 50 grams of activated charcoal in 3 to 4 ounces of water through the stomach tube and again remove stomach contents. Avoid oily laxatives.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This pesticide is toxic to fish, aquatic invertebrates, and aquatic plants. Do not apply directly to water, to areas where surface water is present, or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwater or rinsate. Drift and runoff may be hazardous to aquatic organisms in water adjacent to treated areas. Runoff of this product will be reduced by avoiding applications when rainfall is forecasted to occur within 48 hours.

This chemical has properties and characteristics associated with chemicals detected in groundwater. The use of this chemical in areas where soils are permeable, particularly where the water table is shallow, may result in groundwater contamination.

Ground Water Contamination: Most cases of ground water contamination involving phenoxy herbicides such as MCPA have been associated with mixing/loading and disposal sites. Caution should be exercised when handling MCPA pesticides at such sites to prevent contamination of ground water supplies. Use of closed systems for mixing and transferring this pesticide will reduce the probability of spills. Placement of the mixing/loading equipment on an impervious pad to contain spills will help prevent ground water contamination. Cleaning of Equipment: Do not use the same spray equipment for other purposes unless thoroughly cleaned. When cleaning equipment, do not pour wash water on the ground; spray or drain over a large area away from wells and other water sources.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It Is A Violation Of Federal Law To Use This Product In A Manner Inconsistent With Its Labeling. Read entire label before using this product.

Do not apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons, either directly or through drift. Only protected handlers may be in the area during application. For any requirements specific to your State or Tribe, consult the agency responsible for pesticide regulation.

AGRICULTURAL USE REQUIREMENTS

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard (WPS), 40 CFR Part 170. This Standard contains requirements for the protection of agricultural workers on farms, forests, nurseries and greenhouses, and handlers of agricultural pesticides. It contains requirements for training, decontamination, notification and emergency assistance. It also contains specific instructions and exceptions pertaining to the statements on this label about personal protective equipment (PPE) and restricted-entry interval. The requirements in this box only apply to uses of this product that are covered by the WPS.

Do not enter or allow entry into treated areas during the restricted-entry interval (REI) of 12 hours.

PPE required for early entry to treated areas that is permitted under the WPS and that involves contact with anything that has been treated such as plants, soil or water is: coveralls, chemical-resistant gloves such as barrier laminate, butyl rubber, nitrile rubber or viton and shoes plus socks.

NON-AGRICULTURAL USE REQUIREMENTS

The requirements in this box apply to uses of this product that are NOT within the scope of the Worker Protection Standard for agricultural pesticides (40 CFR part 170). The WPS applies when this product is used to produce agricultural plants on farms, forests, nurseries, or greenhouses.

Do not enter or allow people (or pets) to enter the treated area until sprays have dried.

SPRAY DRIFT MANAGEMENT

Avoiding spray drift at the application site is the responsibility of the applicator. The interaction of many equipment-and-weather-related factors determine the potential for spray drift. The applicator and the grower are responsible for considering all these factors when making decisions.

Apply only as a medium or coarser spray (ASAE standard 572) or a volume mean diameter of 300 microns or greater for spinning atomizer nozzles.

Apply only when the wind speed is 2 to 10 mph at the application site.

Additional requirements for aerial applications:

The boom length must not exceed 75% of the wingspan or 90% of the rotor blade diameter. Release spray at the lowest height consistent with efficacy and flight safety. Do not release spray at a height greater than 10 feet above crop canopy. When applications are made with a crosswind, the swath will be displaced downwind. The applicator must compensate for this displacement at the downwind edge of the application area by adjusting the path of the aircraft upwind. Do not make applications into temperature inversions.

Additional requirements for ground boom applications:

Do not apply with a nozzle height greater than 4 feet above the crop canopy.

RESTRICTIONS

Do not apply this product through any type of irrigation system.

Wheat, barley, oat, rye and flax treated with MCPA may be replanted with any crop specified on an MCPA label or any crop for which a residue tolerance exists for MCPA. For crops not listed on an MCPA label, or on crops for which no residue tolerances for MCPA have been established, a 60 day plantback interval must be observed.

COMPATIBILITY

If this product is to be tank mixed with other pesticides, compatibility should be tested prior to mixing. To test for compatibility, use a small container and mix a small amount (0.5 to 1 quart) of spray, combining all ingredients in the same ratio as the anticipated use. If any indications of physical incompatibility develop, do not use this mixture for spraying. Indications of incompatibility usually will appear within 5 to 15 minutes after mixing. Read and follow all directions and precautions on this label and on the labels of any product(s) for which a tank mixture is being considered.

USE IN LIQUID NITROGEN FERTILIZER

This product may be combined with liquid nitrogen fertilizer suitable for foliage application on grass, pastures, or small grains in one operation. Use product according to directions on this label for those crops. Use liquid nitrogen fertilizer at rates recommended by supplier or Extension Service Specialist. Mix the product and fertilizer according to the following instructions: Fill the spray tank approximately half full with the liquid nitrogen fertilizer. Add the product while agitating the tank. Add the remainder of the fertilizer while continuing to agitate. Apply immediately, maintaining agitation during application until tank is empty. **Do not apply during cold (near freezing) weather.** Spray mixture must be used immediately and may not be stored. Do not allow mixture to stand overnight.

NOTE: If good, continuous agitation is not maintained, separation of the spray mixture and/or clogging of the nozzles is likely to occur. Fertilizers can increase foliage contact burn of herbicides. Reducing the fertilizer rate and concentration will reduce the hazard of leaf burn.

PRODUCT INFORMATION

This product is effective on a wide range of broadleaf weeds and is useful for controlling these weeds in certain crops. Several crops, such as flax, oats, and small grains are more tolerant of MCPA than they are of 2,4-D.

This product is an isooctyl ester formulation of MCPA that mixes easily in water, even in the hard waters found in some areas. Mix thoroughly while diluting this material and mix again if allowed to stand long before spraying.

WEEDS CONTROLLED BY PROPERLY APPLIED TREATMENTS OF THIS HERBICIDE INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

Amaranthus species dandelion pepperweeds ragweed (common and giant)

(pigweeds) field pennycress (except perennial) shepherdspurse common burdock mustard plantains thistle (bull and Russian)

common cocklebur (except blue mustard) purslanes yellow rocket

common lambsquarters

WEED RESISTANCE

Any weed population may contain plants that are naturally resistant to MCPA, the active ingredient in this product, and to other herbicides with the same mode of action. ATTENTION: These resistant weed biotypes will not be controlled by this product. Consult advisors such as your local agricultural extension service for agronomic management practices to minimize the occurrence of MCPA resistance and considerations for supplemental control measures.

Weed Management

To minimize the occurrence of MCPA resistant biotypes, observe the following general weed management practices:

- · Scout application site before and after herbicide applications.
- Start with a clean application site, using either a burndown herbicide application or tillage.
- · Control weeds early when they are relatively small.
- Add other herbicides (e.g. a selective and/or a residual herbicide) and cultural practices (e.g. tillage or crop rotation) where appropriate.
- Utilize the specified label rate for the most difficult to control weed in your field. Avoid tank mixtures with other herbicides that
 reduce this product's efficacy (through antagonism), or tank mixture directions that encourage application rates of this product
 below the label directions.
- Control weed escapes and prevent weeds from setting seeds.
- · Clean equipment before moving from field to field to minimize the spread of weed seed or plant parts.
- Report any incidence of repeated non-performance of this product on a particular weed to your Nufarm representative, local retailer, or county extension agent.

Management of MCPA Resistant Biotypes

Since the occurrence of new MCPA weeds cannot be determined until after product use and scientific confirmation, manufacturer is not responsible for any losses that may result from the failure of this product to control MCPA resistant weed biotypes.

The following good agronomic practices are recommended to reduce the spread of confirmed MCPA resistant biotypes:

- If a naturally occurring resistant biotype is present in your application site, this product should be tank-mixed or applied sequentially with an appropriately labeled herbicide with a different mode of action to achieve control.
- · Cultural and mechanical control practices (e.g. crop rotation or tillage) may also be used as appropriate.
- Scout treated application site after herbicide applications and control escaping weeds including resistant biotypes before they set seed.
- Thoroughly clean equipment before leaving fields known to contain resistant biotypes.

^{*}Use the lower rate if small annual and biennial weeds are the major problem. RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS FOR USE ON SMALL GRAINS

Use a minimum of 10 gallons of water per acre for ground application and 2 gallons of water per acre for aerial application.

Do not allow livestock animals to forage or graze treated areas within 7 days of slaughter.

Do not apply more than 1.6 pints of this product (0.75 lbs. a.e.) per acre per year.

FLAX

FLAX	·	Apply when flax is 2 to 8 inches tall. Do not spray once flax has reached the bud stage.

RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS FOR USE ON FLAX

Do not allow livestock animals to forage or graze treated areas within 7 days of slaughter.

Use a minimum of 8 gallons per acre for ground application and 3 gallons per acre for aerial application.

Do not apply more than 0.5 pint of this product (0.25 lb ae) per acre per year.

ESTABLISHED GRASS PASTURES AND RANGELAND

Annual broadleaf weeds	1 to 2 pints	Apply when weeds are small and actively growing and prior to bud stage. Do not apply to newly seeded areas until grass is well established.
Perennial and biennial broadleaf weeds	2 to 3 pints	not apply when grass is in the boot to milk stage if grass seed production is desired. Bentgrass and legumes may be injured by this treatment.

RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS FOR USE ON PASTURES AND RANGELAND

Do not apply more than 3.2 pints of this product (1.5 lb ae) per acre per year.

Do not apply more than 2 applications per year with a minimum retreatment interval of 21 days.

For ground application, use a minimum of 10 gallons of water per acre.

For aerial application, use a minimum of 2 gallons of water per acre.

Do not graze animals on treated areas within 7 days after treatment.

Annual, biennial and perennial broadleaf weeds	3.2 pints	Apply when annual broadleaf weeds are young and actively growing and perennial and biennial broadleaf weeds are actively growing and near the bud stage but before flowering. A second application may be required for best results on perennial and biennial weeds.

RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS FOR USE IN NON-CROP AREAS

For ground application use a minimum of 10 gallons of water per acre.

For aerial application use a minimum of 2 gallons of water per acre.

Do not apply more than 2 applications per year with a minimum retreatment interval of 21 days.

For Broadcast Application - Do not apply more than 3.2 pints of this product (1.5 lbs ae) per acre per year.

Do not apply more than 2 applications per year with a minimum retreatment interval of 21 days.

For Spot Treatment - Do not apply more than 6.4 pints of this product (3.0 lbs ae) per acre per year.

(Golf Courses, Cemeteries and similar established grass areas)

RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS FOR USE IN TURF AREAS

Do not apply more than 6.4 pints of this product (3.0 lbs ae) per acre per year.

Do not apply more than 2 applications per year with a minimum retreatment interval of 21 days.

For ground application on turf areas use enough water for good coverage (minimum of 10 gallons per acre).

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

PESTICIDE STORAGE: Store in original container in a dry secured storage area. Keep container tightly closed when not in use.

Hold container upside down over application equipment or mix tank or collect rinsate for later use or disposal.
