Spry the shelves to kill any of the named insects present. Place clean paper on the shelves and return packages after shelves have dried. Repeat as necessary.

TO KILL SOWBUGS, CENTIPEDES, FIREBRATS AND SPIDERS: Contact as many insects as possible with the spray. Also thoroughly spray all parts of the room suspected of harboring these pests. Speical attention should be paid to cracks, crevices, hidden surfaces under sinks, behind stoves and refrigerators.

TO KILL FLEAS AND BROWN DOG TICKS: Remove and destroy old pet bedding. Spray sleeping quarters of pets, around baseboards, window and door frames, wall cracks and local areas of floors. Repeat as necessary. Do not spray animals. Put fresh bedding in pets quarters after spray has drieo.
