Dear Mr. Washburn:

The labeling amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable subject to the comments below:

- 1. In the pest list above the PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS section, add a comma (,) and a space after "Mosquitoes" and "Ants".
- 2. Under PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS, make the following changes:
 - a. Correct the spelling of "through" and delete the extra period (.) in the first sentence.
 - b. Delete the following statements:

In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water. Obtain medical attention if irritation persists.

- 3. In the FIRST AID box, add the statement "NOTE TO PHYSICIAN: Contains petroleum distillate vomiting may cause aspiration pneumonia."
- 4. Under the DIRECTIONS FOR USE in the Dilution Directions section:
 - a. Add a dash (-) in "T-12/4" in the first and second sentences.
 - b. Correct the spelling of "part" in the second sentence.
 - c. Add a dash (-) in "d-phenothrin" in the third sentence

5. In the STORAGE AND DISPOSAL box, include the statement "Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal."

You must submit two (2) final printed label before you release the product for shipment. A stamped copy is enclosed for your records.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Dilution Directions: SPEER Concentrate T 12/4 must be diluted with petroleum distillate prior to use either as a space or contact spray. Use 1 paart Concentrate T 12/4 to 24 parts petroleum distillate to make a ready-to-use spray. The resulting spray will contain .48% Tetramethrin and .16% d phenothrin.

NOTE: When used in hospitals, patients should be removed prior to treatment. Ventilate for two hours after treatment. Do not return patients to room until after ventilation. See left panel for spraying directions.

IN MISTING EQUIPMENT: Use spraying device similar to a Microsol machine or cold aerosol generators such as Micro-Gen and Leco.

To Kill Flies, Mosquitoes, Small Flying Moths and Gnats: Close room warehouse or other area to be treated and shut off all ventilating systems. Dispense this product as a fine mist. Use a dosage of one-half ounce per 1,000 cubic feet of room space. Do not remain in treated areas. Leave room closed for ½ hour. Ventilate the area after treatment is completed. Repeat application as necessary for insect control.

IN PRESSURIZED TANK SPRAYERS FOR WETTING CONTACT SPRAYS: To kill the listed insects, the diluted spray should be used as follows at a rate of 1 gallon per 1,000 square feet of surface area.

To kill Cockroaches, Ants, and Crickets: Contact as many insects as possible with the spray in addition to thorough spraying of all parts of the room suspected of harboring these pests. Special attention should be paid to cracks, hidden surfaces under sinks, behind stoves and refrigerators, and wherever these pests are suspected of hiding. To Kill Carpet Beetles: Directly spray as many insects as possible. Spray both interior and exterior of upholstered furniture. Both top and bottom of rugs and carpets should be sprayed thoroughly. Also treat shelves, closets, areas under furniture and wherever these insects are seen or suspected. Repeat as necessary.

To Kill Exposed forms of Confused Flour Beetles, Sawtoothed Grain Beetles, and Rice Weevils: Find and destroy infested package foods. Remove all other items from pantry. Spray the shelves to kill any of the named insects present. Place clean paper on the shelves and return packages after shelves have dried. Apply as a coarse wet spray to all other areas infested with these insects. Pay particular attention to cracks and crevices in floors, walls and ceiling. Repeat as necessary.

To Kill Sowbugs, Firebrats and Spiders: Contact as many insects as possible with the spray. Also thoroughly spray all parts of the room suspected of harboring these pests. Special attention should be paid to cracks, crevices, hidden surfaces under sinks, behind stoves and refrigerators and machinery.
