### General Classification

## Storage and Disposal

Storage: Store in a cool, dry area away from heat or open flame.

## SHAKE WELL BEFORE USING TO KILL FLEAS & TICKS ON DOGS

Hold bottle upright and point nozzle opening in desired direction of spray. Pump the cap up and down with forefinger to create spray. Spray the animal from a distance of 3-12 inches. Start spraying at the tail, moving the dispenser rapidly and making sure that the animal's entire body is covered, including the legs and under the body. While spraying, fluff the hair so the spray will penetrate to the skin. Make sure spray wets thoroughly. Do not spray into eyes, face or scrotum. Repeat as needed.

Apply at a rate of 2 seconds per pound of body weight for thin or short-haired dogs up to 8 seconds per pound of body weight for heavy or long-haired dogs.
