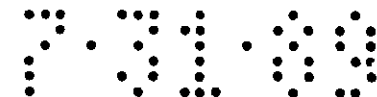

Storage and Disposal

Storage: Store in a cool dry area away from heat or flame.

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT
