# PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

## HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

### CAUTION

Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through skin. Avoid breathing spray mist. Avoid contact with skin or eyes. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling.

#### STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

If swallowed - Call a physician immediately. Gastric lavage is indicated if material is taken internally. DO NOT INDUCE VOMITING. Vomiting may cause aspiration pneumonia.

If inhaled - Remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration, if indicated.

If on skin - Wash with plenty of soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

If in eyes - Flush eyes with plenty of water. Get medical attention immediately.

Do not apply directly to food. In commercial food handling facilities, cover or remove any food and food processing equipment during application. Do not apply while food processing is underway. After spraying in food processing plants, wash all equipment with potable water, benches, shelving, etc., where exposed food will be handled. In the home, all food processing surfaces and utensils should be covered during treatment or thoroughly washed before use.

Remove pets and birds and cover fish aquariums before spraying.

### PHYSICAL HAZARDS

Contents under pressure. Do not use or store near heat or open flame. Do not puncture or incinerate container. Exposure to temperatures above 130°F may cause bursting.

### STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

**Storage:** Store in a cool area away from heat or open flame.

**Disposal:** Do not reuse empty container. Wrap container and put in trash collection.

One Insect Killer is a strong kerosene oil and won't damage carpets, boards. However, care should "soak" fabric-covered furniture with dark padding, as discoloration.

### DIRECTIONS GENERAL CLASSIFICATION

It is a violation of Federal Law to use in a manner inconsistent with the label.

### SHAKE WELL BEFORE USE

To kill Flies, Stable Flies, Mosquitoes, Wasps, Hornets, Sandflies, etc. Close all doors and windows and turn on motion. Spray 5 to 10 seconds (1,000 cubic feet). Keep nozzles close to surfaces. Vacate premises. Keep out 15 minutes after spraying. Ventilate thoroughly before re-entry.

To kill Roaches, Waterbugs, Spiders, Ants, Scorpions, Centipedes, and Fleas: Spray baseboards, cracks, pipes and other hiding places, directly. Spray ant hills and other areas and door sills and other areas, thoroughly spray and sleeping area. Repeat as necessary.

To kill Clothes Moths, Carpet Beetles, etc. articles to be protected, give attention to folds and seams. Spray containers such as closets, etc. regularly. Treatment should be repeated every thirty days unless the article is moth-tight container.

To kill Bedbugs: Spray mattress, especially around seams and head, baseboards and floorboards frequently.

To kill Rice and Granary Weevils, Beetles, Red Flour Beetles, etc. Drug Store Beetles in exposed stages: Contact as many insects when treating infested areas as possible, machinery, and dark spray 10 to 20 seconds per 10 floor space. Repeat treatment until insects appear.

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
