This product is conditionally registered in accordance with FIFRA sec. 3(c)(7)(A) since you have agreed to:

1. Submit an acute eye irritation study (in your fax to the Agency dated October 1, 1992) within six months of the date of this notice.

2. Submit and/or cite all data or other material required for registration/reregistration of your product under FIFRA sec. 3(c)(5) or FIFRA sec. 4 when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.

3. Make the labeling change listed below before you release the product for shipment:

- Add the phrase, "EPA Registration No. 11715-184."
- Revise Statement of Practical Treatment as follows:

IF SWALLOWED: Call a physician or poison control center. Drink one or two glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching back of throat with finger. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

IF ON SKIN: Wash with plenty of soap and water. Get medical attention.

IF INHALED: Remove victim to fresh air. If not breathing give artificial respiration, preferably mouth to mouth. Get medical attention.

The current IF IN EYES statement may be revised following submission of an acceptable eye irritation study.

c. Revise Precautionary Statements as follows:

"Harmful if swallowed, inhaled, or absorbed through skin. Prolonged or frequently repeated contact may cause allergic reactions in some individuals. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. Avoid breathing vapor or spray mist. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Remove contaminated clothing and wash before reuse.

d. The ingredient statement should read "ACTIVE INGREDIENT."

e. Under To Kill Flying Insects the statement should read, ". . Do not remain in treated area and ventilate area before re-entry . ."

f. Replace "Do not use in commercial food . . ." with the following:

Do not use in food/feed areas of food/feed handling establishments, restaurants or other areas where food is commercially prepared or processed. Do not use in serving areas while food/feed is exposed or facility is in operation. Serving areas are areas where prepared foods/feed are served such as dining rooms but excluding areas where foods may be prepared or held. In the home all food processing surfaces and utensils should be covered during treatment or thoroughly washed before use.

Nonfood/nonfeed areas are areas such as garbage rooms, lavatories, floor drains (to sewers), entries and vestibules, offices, locker rooms, machine rooms, boiler rooms, garages, mop closets and storage (after canning or bottling).

g. Use in food handling establishments can imply use in U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Meat and Poultry Plants. Therefore, either add the statement, "Not for Use in USDA Meat and Poultry Plants," or submit an application to USDA requesting use in these areas. If granted, you can then indicate on the label that the product can be used in these areas.

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- h. Add the precaution: "Do not apply when classrooms are in use."

Guidelines require that for eye irritation studies the aerosol product be tested by direct spray in the animal eye. The subject product was not tested in this manner. You must submit (see comment 1) an acceptable eye irritation study performed in accordance with (Subdivision F) Pesticide Assessment Guidelines.

The acute inhalation study was graded as core minimum data since dose levels were not properly spaced to product groups with a range of mortality rates. Furthermore, each dose level should include at least ten animals (5 males and 5 females).

4. Submit five copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment. Refer to the A-79 Enclosure for a further description of final printed labeling.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA sec. 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

FOR USE IN HOUSEHOLDS, SCHOOLS, WAREHOUSES, OFFICE BUILDINGS, THEATERS, GARAGES, HOTELS, MOTELS AND KENNELS. ATTACH EXTENSION TUBE TO SPRAY ACTUATOR:

TO KILL COCKROACHES, ANTS, CRICKETS, WATERBUGS, PALMETTO BUGS, SCORPIONS, AND PILLBUGS: Spray on floors along baseboards in the kitchen and baths. Special attention should be paid to areas around refrigerators and entry points such as doors, windows, vents, pipes, etc.
TO KILL FLYING INSECTS (e.g. mosquitoes, flies, gnats, wasps, and bees): Close space to be treated. Spray above head with a sweeping motion 3 feet from surfaces. Use 10 grams (10 seconds) per 1,000 cubic feet space. Keep treated areas closed for at least 3

minutes after spraying. Ventilate and repeat as necessary.
TO KILL SOWBUGS, CENTIPEDES, FIREBRATS AND SPIDERS: Spray as possible with the spray. Treat parts of the room suspected. Special attention should be paid to hidden surfaces under sinks and toilets.
TO KILL CARPET BEETLES: Spray on carpets, floors, baseboards, shelves, and carpet to dry thoroughly before use as necessary.
TO KILL BEDBUGS: Spray around tufts and seams. Take apart all joints. Treat baseboard. Allow all treated articles to dry. Repeat treatment as necessary.
TO CONTROL CLOTHES MOTHES: Treat infested articles from storage, for several hours in sunlight, liberally to empty chests, closets, storages, directing the spray into crevices. After airing, infested articles should be disposed of, tightly, keeping nozzle at least 1 foot away to avoid staining.
TO KILL EXPOSED STAGES OF FLOUR BEETLES, RUST RED FLOUR BEETLES, GRANARY WEEVILS, GRAIN BEETLES, MEAL WORMS, cracks and crevices, process areas, around cartons or containers. These insects tend to congregate. 45 minutes to 1 hour after treatment, as necessary. Infested stored food should be disposed of.
TO KILL FLEAS AND BROWN TICKS: and destroy pet's old bedding. of pets, around baseboards, wall cracks and local areas of infestation.
