1. Submit and/or cite all data required for registration/ reregistration of your product when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit data; and submit acceptable responses required for reregistration of your product under FIFRA section 4.
2. Submit the results of a one-year storage stability study (guideline 830.6317) under typical warehouse conditions, and the results of a corrosion characteristics study (guideline 830.6320), which may be carried out concurrently. It is recommended that observations be made at 0, 3, 6, 9, and 12 months. The Agency requests that the data be submitted in both electronic and paper copies.
3. You have applied for the registration of a product containing the active ingredient etofenprox. The Agency has conditioned the original registration of which you are a follow-on with conditional data requirements including an expiration date. This registration will also be approved under the same conditions and expiration date. Accordingly, you must take steps to ensure that these required data are submitted. These steps could include generating and submitting the data yourself, or you may offer to share with other registrants the cost of conducting testing.

Non-food and non-feed areas of food and feed establishments are areas such as garbage rooms, lavatories, floor drains (to sewer entries and vestibules), offices, locker rooms, machine rooms, boiler rooms, garages, mop closets and storage (after canning and bottling).

For best results, treat entire dwelling with particular attention to kitchen and bathroom areas. Use only one fogger for each 750 sq. ft. (25' x 30' area or 6,000 cubic feet) of floor space. *[Note to the Reviewer: A conversion of 1 ounce per 1,000 cubic feet of room space applies. Example - a 4 ounce aerosol can will treat 4,000 cubic feet of unobstructed area. Room sizes are changed accordingly.]*

Close outside doors and windows and turn off fans and air conditioners. DO NOT use more than one fogger per room. DO NOT use in small enclosed spaces such as closets, cabinets or under counter or tables. Do not use in a room 5 ft. x 5 ft. or smaller; instead, allow fogs to enter from other rooms. Turn off ALL ignition sources such as pilot lights (shut off gas valves), other open flames or running electrical

appliances that cycle off and on (i.e., refrigerators, thermostats, etc.). Call your gas utility or management company if you need assistance with your pilot lights.

Open interior doors and closets of area to be treated. Open all cupboards and drawers and remove contents. Remove pets and birds. Tightly cover fish aquariums.

Place can in the middle of the room, on a stand, table, chair or on the floor. Place several layers of unfolded newspaper, covering a 2 sq. ft. area directly under can to prevent marring of surface.

Keeping at arm's length, point top of can away from face and press down actuator tab to lock into position and release fogging action. Set can in an upright position and leave treated area for at least two hours. Also, remove pets and keep out of treated area for at least 2 hours. After 2 hours, open all doors and windows, turn on air conditioners and fans and ventilate the treated area for 30 minutes

NOTE: Asphalt tile and some plastics may be affected by this product. Place newspaper on asphalt tile before treatment and cover plastic items such as plastic furniture, stereo covers, eye glasses, etc.

Repeat treatments to infested areas as necessary at intervals of 14 days or greater. Do not make more than 6 applications per site per year.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

STORAGE: Store in a cool, dry area away from heat or open flame.

DISPOSAL: Do Not Puncture or Incinerate!

If empty: Place in trash or offer for recycling if available.

If partly filled: Call your local solid waste agency or 1-800-CLEANUP for disposal instructions.
