Your Amendment Dated November 18, 1987

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with the Label Improvement Program Notice for Antimicrobial Products Used as Food Contact Surface Sanitizers, is acceptable provided that you:

1. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling.
 - a. Delete "General Classification."
 - b. Correct the spelling of "reated" to "treated."
 - c. Delete "Sodium Carbonate" from the active ingredient statement. It is considered an inert ingredient. Adjust your percentage accordingly.
 - d. The signal word "DANGER" must be placed directly below the "Keep Out of Reach of Children" heading.
 - e. Delete the statement "For sale to, use and storage by maintenance personnel only." Delete the word "milk."
 - f. Under the "Directions for Use" heading, add the following misuse statement immediately below to read:

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.


- g. Change the statement "May cause severe eye irritation or damage. Causes skin irritation" to read "Causes severe eye and skin damages."
2. Submit five (5) copies of final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment.

Your release for shipment of the product bearing the amended labeling constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

Edsan Triple-D is an effective antibacterial cleaner designed for use in industrial and institutional cleaning. When used as directed, EDSAN Triple-D will disinfect hard surfaces such as floors, walls and furniture. It may be relied upon to deodorize bathroom areas, garbage pails, kennel areas and other areas where obnoxious odors may develop. This product may be used as a general purpose antibacterial detergent in schools, public rooms and in other areas where efficient cleaning and antimicrobial action is desired.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

FOR CLEANING

Lightly soiled areas- surfaces to be cleaned should be mopped or brushed with a solution containing 1 ounce of EDSAN Triple-D per gallon of water.

Heavily soiled areas- mop or brush soiled surface with a solution containing 2-3 ounces of EDSAN Triple -D per gallon of water.

GENERAL PURPOSE DISINFECTION

To disinfect walls, floors and other hard surfaces in schools, rest rooms and other public areas, mop or brush surface to be treated with a solution containing 1½ ounces of EDSAN Triple-D per gallon of water. Treated surfaces must remain wet for 10 minutes. Surfaces that are heavily soiled should be cleaned with 2 ounces of EDSAN Triple-D per gallon of water and then disinfected. Prepare a fresh solution daily or when used solution becomes visibly dirty.

DEODORIZATION

To deodorize surfaces during cleaning mop or brush surfaces with a solution containing 2 ounces of EDSAN Triple-D per gallon of water.

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

1,700-1 5/15

In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. For eyes, call a physician. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before reuse.

If swallowed drink promptly a large quantity of egg whites, gelatin solution or if these are not available drink a large quantity of water. Avoid alcohol. Call a physician immediately.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN

Probable mucosal damage may contraindicate the use of gastric lavage. Measure against circulatory shock, respiratory depression and convulsion may be needed.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

HAZARDS TO HUMAN AND DOMESTIC ANIMAL

DANGER

CORROSIVE: May cause severe eye irritation or damage. Causes skin irritation. Harmful if swallowed. Avoid contamination of food, water or feed. To protect eyes, wear goggles or face shield and to protect skin, wear rubber gloves when handling.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

This product must be kept under locked storage sufficient to make it inaccessible to children or persons unfamiliar with its proper use.

- Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.
- Open dumping is prohibited.
- Do not reuse empty container.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL

Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL

PLASTIC CONTAINERS

Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill or incineration, or, if allowed by state and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay clear of smoke.

METAL CONTAINERS

Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other procedures approved by state and local authorities.

GENERAL

Consult federal, state or local disposal authorities for approved alternative procedures such as limited open burning.
