The purpose of this submission is to revise your label in accordance with PR

Notices 2001 and 2001-6 and to make other minor changes.

Label review

The labeling submitted with the above letter, under the Federal Insecticide. Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) is acceptable, provided you submit one (1) copy of final printed labeling to us, with the following changes, before you ship your product.

- 1. On the Front Panel, change "WARNING" to "DANGER".
- 2. Next to "DANGER", add "POISON" (in red) and Skull and Crossbones.
- 3. Change "For Formulating Use Only" to "A Rodenticide Only for Formulation into Registered Products for Use In and Around Structures and Inside Transport Vehicles to Kill Norway Rats, Roof Rats, and House Mice."
- 4. Under "Note to Physician or Veterinarian", delete "as ... overdoses.
- 5. Change "PESTICIDE STORAGE" to "STORAGE".
- 6. After "Exposure ... avoided.", add "Warfarin may cause harm to the fetus, including possible birth defects."

- 7. Under "Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals", change "May be fatal" to "Fatal".
- 8. "For handling activities", to "When mixing baits".
