
Make the following label changes before you release the product for shipment:

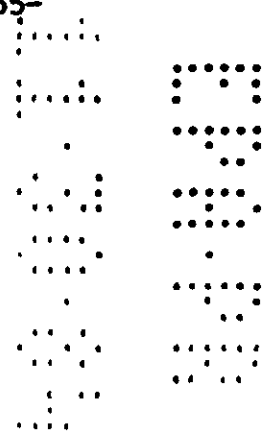

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

USE RESTRICTIONS:

Treated baits must be placed in locations not accessible to children, pets, domestic animals, wildlife or placed in tamper-proof bait stations. Do not place baits in areas where there is a possibility of contaminating food or surfaces that come in direct contact with food.

For control of House mice in and around homes, industrial, commercial, agricultural, poultry buildings, and similar manmade structures. QUINTOX may also be used inside transport vehicles (ships, trains, aircraft) and in and around related port or terminal buildings.

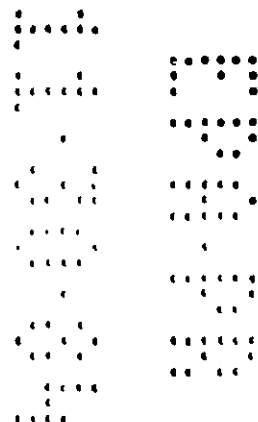
SELECTION OF TREATMENT AREAS:

Determine areas where mice will most likely find and consume the bait. Generally, these areas are along walls, by gnawed openings, in or beside burrows, in corners and concealed places, between floors and walls or in locations where rodents or their signs have been observed. Protect bait from rain or snow. Remove as much food as possible.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS

HOUSE MICE: Apply $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce of QUINTOX at intervals of 8 to 12 feet per placement. Larger placements (up to 1 ounce) may be needed at points of high mouse activity. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for 10 days or until all signs of mouse activity cease.

MICE: Replace contaminated or spoiled bait immediately. Collect and dispose of all dead animals and unconsumed bait properly. To prevent reinfestation, eliminate food, water, and harborage as much as possible. If reinfestation does occur, repeat treatment. Where a continuous source of infestation is present, establish permanent bait stations and replenish bait as needed.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS
