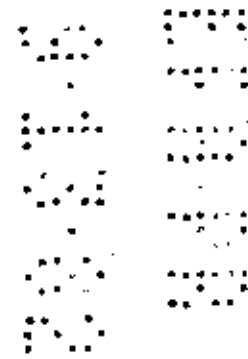

SHOCK
For Swimming Pool Care

It is a violation of federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Shock is needed for algae control, when continuous chlorine residuals have not been maintained and to destroy ammonium complexes that have formed in the pool. If algae growth develops, a slimy feel to pool sides or cloudy pool water exists, shock treatment should be initiated. Adjust pool water PH to 7.4 - 7.6 and add one gallon of shock, in the evening, for each 12,000 gallons of pool water. This dosage is equivalent to 3 PPM available chlorine. Circulate pool water a minimum of 4 hours. Turn off recirculation system and brush pool sides and bottom to loosen dead algae. Additional treatment may be required if necessary. Do not use pool until chlorine residual falls below 3PPM. Shock is recommended for spring openings as well as every other week or more often during heavy use periods or exposure to high temperatures or strong sunlight.

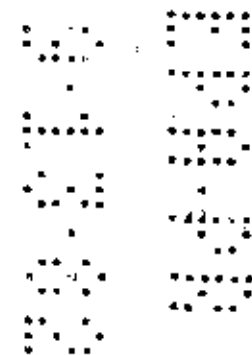

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL Store in a cool, dry area away from direct sunlight. In case of spill, flood area with large quantities of water. Rinse empty container thoroughly with water and either return to manufacturer or discard by placing in trash collection or burning (if approved and). Product or residue that cannot be used should be diluted with water and disposed of in a sanitary sewer. Do not contaminate food or feed. Thoroughly clean and dry all equipment.

FIRST AID If on skin, wash with plenty of soap and water. If in eyes, flush with water for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention. If swallowed, drink large quantities of milk or give emulsion. If these are not available, drink large quantities of water. Do not induce vomiting. Get prompt medical attention.

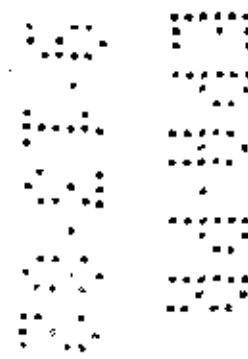
NOTE This product degrades with age. Use a chlorine test kit and increase dosage, as necessary, to obtain the required level of available chlorine.


