It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

This product is for sale to, use and storage only by commercial ornamental nurseries and for Certification under the USDA Imported Fire Ant (IFA) Quarantine program.

Do not make aerial applications of this product. Do not apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons, either directly or through drift. Only protected handlers may be in the treatment area during application. For any requirements specific to your State or Tribe, consult the agency responsible for pesticide regulation.

Agricultural Use Requirements

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard, 40 CFR Part 170. Imported Fire Ant* Control in Ornamental Nurseries for Professional Use in Commercial Production Individual Mound Treatment: Treat individual fire ant mounds during early morning or late evening hours (when ants are least active), gently and evenly applying ½ oz. (1 tablespoon [Tbs]) of this product to the surface and surrounding two feet of active fire ant mounds. Use this product in Imported Fire Ant Quarantined areas, when the nursery stock is to be shipped outside the guarantined area.

For Certification under USDA Imported Fire Ant Quarantine: In Container and Field Grown Woody Ornamentals ("B&B Stock"): Using conventional calibrated ground equipment suitable to the treatment area[s], broadcast this product at the rate of 50 lbs per 17,424 sq ft (6 lbs A.I. per acre) as a pre-harvest treatment to ornamental (non-food bearing) plants. For certification under the USDA Imported Fire Ant (IFA) Quarantine program, use this product 3-5 days after an application of an approved fenoxycarb, hydramethylnon, methoprene or pyriproxyfen bait. Broadcast this product at the rate of 125 lbs per acre (6 lbs A.I. per acre). Treatment area must extend at least 10 feet beyond the base of all plants that are to be certified. Exposure period is 30 days and plants are certifiable 30 days after completion of the treatment sequence. The certification period is 12 weeks; an additional 12 weeks of certification may be obtained with a second application of this product at the rate of 50 pounds per 17,424 sq ft (6 lbs A.I. per acre). Maximum application rate is two applications of this product per year with a minimum of 12 weeks between applications. Refer to current USDA IFA quarantine guidelines before treatment for certification.

*Will kill Fire Ants that come into contact with the granule.

The buffer distances specified in the below table are the distances in feet that must exist to separate sensitive sites from the targeted application site. Buffers are measured from the edge of the sensitive site to the edge of the application site.

Sensitive sites are areas frequented by non-occupational bystanders (especially children). These include residential lawns, pedestrian sidewalks, outdoor recreational areas such as school grounds, athletic fields, parks and all property associated with buildings occupied by humans for residential or commercial purposes. Sensitive sites include homes, farmworker housing or other residential buildings, schools, daycare centers, nursing homes and hospitals. Non-residential agricultural buildings, including barns, livestock facilities, sheds and outhouses are not included in this prohibition.
