

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS DANGER

May be fatal if swallowed, inhaled, or absorbed through skin. Do not get in eyes, on skin, or on clothing. Causes delayed chemical burns. Do not take internally. Do not breathe vapors. Use with adequate ventilation. Wash thoroughly after skin contact, and before eating, drinking, use of tobacco products, or using restrooms.

The U.S. EPA has determined that pentachlorophenol can product defects in the offspring of laboratory animals. Exposure to pentachlorophenol during pregnancy should be avoided. Applicators must wear gloves impervious to the wood treatment formulations (e.g., polyvinyl acetate (PVA), polyvinyl chloride (PVC), or neoprene). In all situations where dermal contact is expected (e.g., during the actual application process and when handling freshly treated wood).

Applicators must wear long sleeved shirts, long pants, and an impermeable apron during the application and mixing processes and all situations where dermal contact is expected.

Work clothing must be changed when it shows signs of contamination. Launder work clothing separately from other household clothing. Dispose of worn-out work clothing and workshoes or boots in any general landfill, in the trash, or in any other manner approved for pesticide disposal.

Applicators must not eat, drink, or use tobacco products during those parts of the application process that may expose them to the wood treatment formulation.

Wash thoroughly after skin contact, and before eating, drinking, use of tobacco products, or using restrooms.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This product is toxic to fish. Do not apply directly to water. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes.

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

APPLICATION TO POLES

Remove earth from around pole to a depth of 18 inches. Use a steel brush to remove dirt and loose, decayed wood. It is recommended increment borings be taken to determine if decay exists in the center of the pole. These holes should be plugged with treated wood plugs. Inspect pole for extent of decay. If found to be sub-standard it should be replaced. Pol-Grease should be applied at 1/4 inch thickness. It may be applied to waterproof paper by brush, swab or mechanical devices designed to make preservative bandages. Pol-Grease may be applied directly to the pole by brush or swab. Then, the treated area should be wrapped with waterproof paper before backfilling the hole. Pol-Grease should cover the last evidence of decay by 4 inches and be applied 3 inches above ground-line. Grease preservative 1/4" thickness. Wrap bandage tightly, stapling or nailing in place. Back-fill and tamp dirt firmly, mounding within an inch of bandage top. Do not pile back-fill above top edge of treatment bandage.
