In order to protect health and the environment, the Administrator, on his motion, may at any time suspend or cancel the registration of a pesticide in accordance with the Act. The acceptance of any name in connection with the registration of a product under this Act is not to be construed as giving the registrant a right to exclusive use of the name or to its use if it has been covered by others.

This product is reregistered in accordance with FIFRA section 4(g)(2)(C) provided you:

- 1. Submit and/or cite all data required for registration review/reregistration of your product when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit data.
2. Make the following revisions to the final printed labeling:
a. Based on toxicity ranking per the acute toxicity review, the First Aid statements should be placed on the label in the following order:

IF INHALED..."
b. Per the acute toxicity review, the Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals section must read as follows:

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Reregistration Notice

Note: The text, "Wear protective eyewear such as goggles, face shield or safety glasses" and "Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco or using the toilet. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before reuse." May remain in the Hazard to Human and Domestic Animal section.

- c. Per the product chemistry review, make the following revisions to the Storage and Disposal section of the label:
 - 1. Under the Storage and Disposal heading, the word "Prohibitions" should be deleted. The statement "Do not contaminate water, food or feed...cleaning of equipment" must be changed to "Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal."
 - 2. The statements "Open burning and dumping is prohibited" and "Do not re-use empty container" should be incorporated with the Container Disposal statements.
 - 3. The Pesticide Disposal statements must be revised to read: "Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardouw. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law. If these wastes cannot be disposed by use according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance."

- 3. A stamped copy of your labeling is enclosed for your records. You must submit one (1) copy of the final printed label before you release the product for shipment or the next printing of the label whichever occurs first. Products shipped after 12 months from the date of this Notice must bear the new revised label. If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA sec. 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

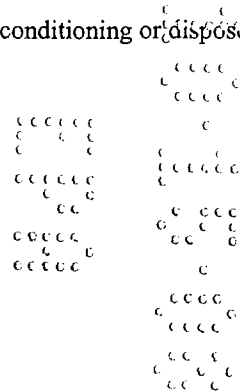
