Danger

PHYSICAL AND CHEMICAL HAZARDS

Strong oxidizing agent. Mix only with water. Use clean utensils. Do not add this product to any dispensing device containing remnants of any other product. Contamination with moisture, organic matter or other chemicals may start a chemical reaction with generation of heat, generation of hazardous gases and possible generation of fire or explosion. In case of contamination or decomposition do not re-use container. If possible isolate container and keep out of work area. Flush area flooded with large volume of water if necessary.

EGG Wash Sanitizer is recommended for use in spray machines to sanitize and clean eggs prior to sale. EGG Wash Sanitizer is also recommended for use in sanitizing dishes, glasses, food processing equipment and utensils including dairy and brewery equipment and utensils.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

For egg wash: Dissolve one ounce of EGG Wash Sanitizer in ten gallons of warm (125° F) water. This provides 100 ppm of available chlorine. With a conveyor type machine, spray with the 100 ppm available chlorine solution and allow eggs to drain and dry. Eggs may be rinsed with potable water if desired.

For dishes, glasses, food processing equipment and utensils: Dissolve one ounce of EGG Wash Sanitizer per ten gallons of warm (125° F) water. This provides 100 ppm of available chlorine. Clean and rinse items prior to sanitizing. Then dip the items to be sanitized in solution, hold for two or three minutes and remove, allow to drip dry. The same solution may be used in the feed tank for immersion or spray-type machines providing two to five minutes contact time for sanitizing dishes, glasses and food processing equipment and utensils. The items are then ready for use.

The sanitizing solutions should be used promptly after mixing. If the solution is allowed to stand or is reused and tests show the level of chlorine has not been maintained, add bleach. EGG Wash Sanitizer should be added to maintain a minimum concentration of 100 ppm available chlorine.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Keep product dry and glassed container when not in use. Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area away from heat or open flame. In case of a decomposition isolate container if possible, and flood with large volume of water to dissolve all material before disposal. Do not mix with other chemicals. For use in application, see the Safety and Safe page.
