Dear Ms. Chan;

The label referred to above, submitted in connection with the registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable with the following changes:

Agricultural Use label

- On the front panel specify Carbaryl (1-Naphthyl N-methylcarbamate).
- Revise the heading GENERAL USE PRECAUTIONS to read USE PRECAUTIONS.
- Revise the sentence "Begin applications when insects or damage is first observed and repeat on a regular 5 to 7 day schedule or as necessary for good insect control' to read "Apply when insect or their damage first appears. Do not repeat application more than once per week per crop, unless otherwise indicated in the directions for use."
- Specify "A dusting powder for the control of listed insect pests."
- Your label directions must be revised to provide directions for use on how to apply the product, e.g., ""...use a shaker can, dust gun, puffer or other bulbous duster."
- Change the heading IMPORTANT PRE-HARVEST AND GRAZING USE
 INFORMATION AND LIMITATIONS to "PRE-HARVEST AND GRAZING USE

INFORMATION AND RESTRICTIONS".

- Under the heading "PRE-HARVEST AND GRAZING USE... change "...without resulting in residues in milk or meat." to read "...without resulting in illegal residues in milk or meat."
- Under the heading PRE-HARVEST AND GRAZING USE... add "Do not use reclaimed irrigation water from crops treated with carbaryl on crops for which carbaryl tolerances are not established."
- Under the heading PRE-HARVEST AND GRAZING USE... add "Do not plant rotational food and feed crops not listed on this label or other carbaryl labels in carbaryl treated soil."
- Under WARRANTY, revise "OUR RECOMMENDATIONS FOR USE..." to read "The directions for use..."
- For each crop, under RESTRICTIONS AND PRECAUTIONS, change to RESTRICTIONS.
- For each crop, under RESTRICTIONS, add a sentence "Do not apply more than xx lb a/A per year."
- Specify the net contents on the label.

Home and Garden Use label (this product is required to be packaged as a ready-to-use shaker can)

- On the front panel specify Carbaryl (1-Naphthyl N-methylcarbamate).
- Revise the heading GENERAL USE PRECAUTIONS to read USE PRECAUTIONS.
- Under PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS, revise the box to read:

CAUTION: Harmful if swallowed. Harmful is absorbed through skin. Avoid breathing dust. Avoid contact with eyes, skin or clothing. Wear long-sleeved shirt, long pants, shoes and socks, and household latex or rubber gloves. Follow manufacturer's instructions for cleaning/maintaining clothing/gloves. If no such instructions for washables exist, use detergent and hot water. Keep and wash clothing/gloves used for applying product separately from other laundry.

 Revise USER SAFETY RECOMMENDATIONS to read RESIDENTIAL USER SAFETY RECOMMENDATIONS.

- Under RESIDENTIAL USER SAFETY RECOMMENDATIONS, revise the sentence "Remove clothing/PPE immediately if pesticide gets inside" to read "Remove clothing, shoes and gloves immediately if pesticide gets inside."
- Under RESIDENTIAL USER SAFETY RECOMMENDATIONS, revise the sentence "Remove PPE immediately after handling this product." to read "Remove clothing, shoes and gloves immediately after using this product."
- Revise the application rates to make more sense to the user, e.g., revise the application rate, e.g., 0.25 to read $1/4^{th}$ pound etc.
- If there is more than one container size, then certain of the directions for use may need to be removed from the label. For example, if container size is one pound, then the directions for use on earwigs must be deleted from the label, since the directions for use cannot require more of the product than is contained in the package.
- Delete the paragraph headed with IMPORTANT PRE-HARVEST AND GRAZING USE INFORMATIONS AND LIMITATIONS. This is not appropriate for a homeowner product.
- Under METHOD OF APPLICATION AND USE PRECAUTIONS, delete the phrases "...avoid drift and contact with eyes and skin." and ""...avoid contact with dusted surfaces."
- Under METHOD OF APPLICATION AND USE PRECAUTIONS, revise the first sentence to read: "Using this shaker can, dust lightly to cover both upper and lower leaf surfaces with a thin, even film of dust."
- Under LAWNS revise chiggers and spiders to read chiggers** and spiders**.
- Under LAWNS revise "Will only kill pests present at the time..." to read "Non-residual treatment. Will only kill pests present at the time..."
- Under LAWNS (Spot Treatment Only), specify "..., using this shaker can, apply at the rate of 8 ozs. Per 5000 sq. ft."
- Under LAWNS, delete "earwigs" (since there are separate directions for use directions for use for this pest).
- Under WARRANTY, revise "OUR RECOMMENDATIONS FOR USE..." to read "The

directions for use..."

- Under EARWIGS, revise the directions for use to read "Apply using this shaker can at rate of 8 ozs. per 500 sq. ft. Apply around the outside foundation wall of the home. Treat in front of steps and other entrance areas. Apply also around refuse piles, lumber, mulch and other concealment areas. Repeat in 10 days or when earwigs become troublesome."
- Revise the STORAGE AND DISPOSAL to read similar to: Storage: Store pesticide in original container and place in a locked storage area. Disposal: If empty: Do not reuse this container. Place in trash or offer for recycling if available. If partially filled: Call your local solid waste agency or 1-800-CLEANUP for disposal instructions. Never place unused product down any indoor or outdoor drain."
- Specify the net contents on the label.

A stamped copy is enclosed for your records. Please submit on copy of the final printed label before releasing the product for shipment.

Approval of this label does not constitute approval of your application for reregistration of this product. Product reregistration is currently pending, and future labeling changes and/or additional data may be required.
