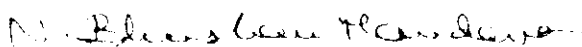

1. ACQU.

- Acquire pH of pool water. (0 to 7.2) to 7.8 range with pH increase as required following test as to obtain pool water which is free of harmful algae. 2. Add a fast acting chlorinating product to the water. Start at 2.0 ppm. Do not alter the pool until the chlorine residual has decreased below 2.0 (approx. 10 ppm per month)
- Test water (chlorine residual using a test kit) 1. Add water (chlorine residual using a test kit) 2. Add chlorine residual using a test kit (0.5 to 1.0 ppm) 3. Repeat treatment until proper level is reached
