To revise the "First Aid" Statement in accordance with PR Notice 2001-1

# **Conditions**

- 1. Place the "First Aid" Statement on front panel of the label.
- 2. Under the "Environmental Hazard Statement" revise the first sentence to read: "This pesticide is toxic to fish and aquatic organisms".
- 3. Change the re-entry level for swimming pools to read: "The re-entry into treated swimming pools is prohibited above levels of 3 ppm chlorine residual".,

Blue Shield® P.D.Q.Tabs® provide effective control of bacteria and algae growth in pool water. DO NOT add this product directly to pool water or to continuous tablet chlorinating devices. P.D.Q.Tabs® are intended for addition to the pool skimmer or into a floating dispenser. Do not mix this product with any other chemical.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAM: Probable mucosal damage may contraindicate the use of gastric lavage.

#### **DIRECTIONS FOR USE**

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

START-UP: When starting up a reopened or freshly filled swimming pool, make sure that the filtration system is clean and operating properly. Then adjust and maintain the pH in the range of 7.2 to 7.6. Use Blue Shield® pH Increase or pH Decrease as indicated by a reliable test kit. Then superchlorinate with one of Blue Shield® fast acting chlorinating products, following labet directions, to establish a free chlorine residual of 1.0 to 1.5 ppm (parts per million). If your pool has not been stabilized previously, add Blue Shield Conditioner and Stabilizer (cyanuric acid) until 30 ppm is obtained following label directions.

DAILY: Add P.D.Q.Tabs® to pool skimmer with filter running. Keep filter running until P.D.Q.Tabs® completely dissolve. Maintain a 1.0 to 1.5 ppm chlorine residual. A suggested dosage is one P.D.Q.Tab® per 5,000 gallons of water daily. This dosage

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may vary due to unusual conditions such as heavy bather loads, wind, heavy rain and high temperatures. Therefore, frequent use of a test kit is recommended as a guide to maintain the pH at 7.2 to 7.6 and the chlorine residual at 1.0 to 1.5 ppm.
The re-entry into treated swimming pools is prohibited above levels of 2 ppm chlorine residual.

# PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

#### HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

## STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

In case of decomposition, isolate container, if possible, in open air or well ventilated area. Flood with large volumes of water if necessary to dissolve all material before discarding container in trash. Do not contaminate food or feed by storage, disposal or cleaning of equipment.
