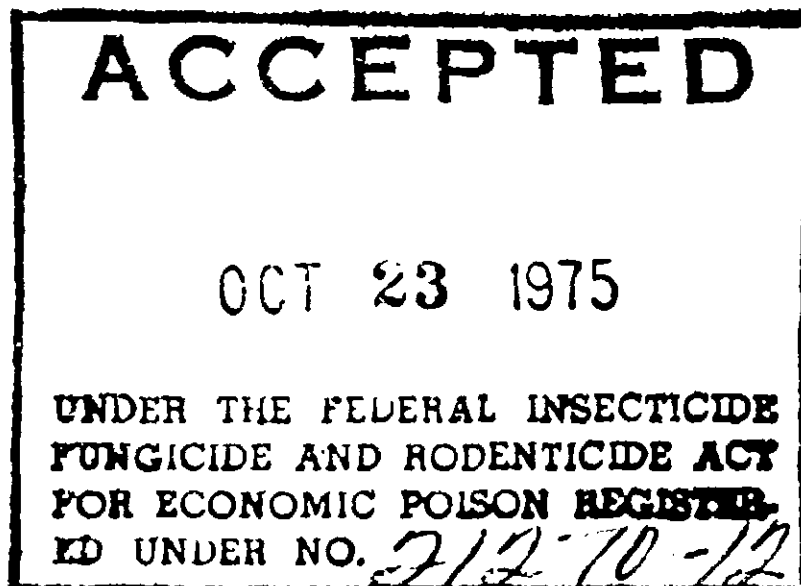

CONSERVE II

HOUSEHOLD CLEANER, DEODORIZER, DISINFECTANT

KILLS Dangerous Staph and Salmonella Germs, Influenza A₂ (Hong Kong Flu Virus), Trichophyton interdigitale (Athlete's Foot Fungus) and Household Germs on inanimate environmental surfaces.

Use to Clean, Deodorize and Disinfect: Floors, Kitchen, Bathroom, Basement, Pet Areas, Laundry Areas, Walls, Sink, Shower Stall, Closets and Diaper Pail.

Use on painted and finished wood work and all hard, non-porous surfaces.

DIRECTIONS:

For General Purpose Cleaning, Deodorizing and Disinfection, use 2 ounces (¼ cup) to one gallon of warm water. Apply with a wet mop, cloth or sponge to wet surface thoroughly.

For Tough Jobs use full strength (wear rubber gloves) on lipstick, heel marks, tar, grease, white wall tires and then rinse with water.

To Sanitize and Deodorize food contact surfaces use one ounce CONSERVE II to one gallon of water and apply with a clean cloth or sponge. Rinse with clean water.

Rinse empty container with water before discarding.

WARNING:

Keep out of reach of children. Causes eye and skin irritation. Avoid contamination of food. Harmful if swallowed.

FIRST AID:

In case of accidental contact with eyes, flush with plenty of water and contact a physician. Avoid getting concentrate on skin. In case of contact, flush with large amounts of water to avoid possible skin irritation. If accidentally swallowed drink large amounts of water and contact your physician immediately.
