The Agency, in accordance with the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, has completed reviewing all the information submitted with your application to support the reregistration of the referenced product in connection with the MGK-264. Piperonyl butoxide, and Allethrin REDs and has concluded that your submission is acceptable.

NOTE: This product is not being reregistered under sections 3(c)5 and 4(g) of FIFRA at this time.

Please be reminded that 40 CFR Part 156.140(a)(4) requires that a batch code, lot number, or other code identifying the batch of the pesticide distributed and sold be placed on non-refillable containers. The code may appear either on the label or durably marked on the container itself, and can be added by non-notification per PRN 98-10.

Please note that the record for this product currently contains the Confidential Statements of Formulation (CSFs) listed below. Any previously dated CSFs are superseded.

Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals

FLAMMABLE. Contents under pressure. Keep away from heat, sparks and open flame. Do not puncture or incinerate container. Exposure to temperatures above 130° F may cause bursting.

Environmental Hazards

This pesticide is toxic to aquatic organisms, including fish and invertebrates. Do not apply directly to or near water. Drift and run-off may be hazardous to fish in water adjacent to treated areas. DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

SHAKE WELL BEFORE USE

Precautions and Restrictions:

Entry Restrictions: Do not enter or allow others to enter until sprays have dried.

Application Restrictions: do not apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons, either directly or through drift. Only protected handlers may be in the area during application. Do not wet articles to the point of runoff or drip. Do not use treated article until spray has dried. Do not wet plants to point of runoff or drip. Remove or cover exposed food and drinking water before application. Remove or cover dishes, utensils, food processing equipment and food preparation surfaces, or wash them before reuse. Do not use in aircraft cabins. Except when applying to sewers or drains as instructed on this label, do not apply directly to sewers or drains, or to any area like a gutter where drainage to sewers, storm drains, water bodies, or aquatic habitat can occur. Outdoor uses are limited to spot treatments only. Broadcast applications are prohibited. Do not make applications during rain. Do not apply more than 1 time per day.

Remove pets, birds, and cover fish aquariums before spraying. Do not allow adults, children or pets to enter the treated area or contact treated surfaces until spray has dried.

Avoid contamination of food or feedstuffs. Do not use in the food/feed areas of food handling establishments, restaurants or other areas where food/feed is commercially prepared or processed. Do not use in serving areas while food is exposed or facility is in operation. Serving areas are areas where prepared foods are served such as dining rooms but excluding areas where foods may be prepared or held. Nonfood/feed areas are areas such as garbage rooms, lavatories, floor drains (to sewers), entries, and vestibules, offices, locker rooms, machine rooms, boiler rooms, garages, mop closets and storage (after canning or bottling). Do not use in rooms/areas while occupied by patients, the elderly or the infirm. Do not apply in classrooms while in use. Do not apply to institutions (including libraries, sports facilities, etc.) in the immediate area when occupants are present.

Use this spray as a spot [surface] or crack and crevice treatment to control cockroaches, fleas, silverfish, ticks, waterbugs, and other insects listed below. Apply this product only to localized areas where pests are found or may occur. One 16 oz. aerosol can treats up to 625 sq. ft. as a spot [surface] treatment, or up to 3,000 sq. ft. as a crack and crevice treatment. Reapply every 4 weeks as needed.

Extension Tube Use: This product is supplied with an extension tube which is taped to one side of the can. Place extension tube into spray nozzle. When applying product, inset extension tube into cracks, crevices, holes and other openings and dispense for 2 seconds. In serious infestations, if possible, place treatment approximately 12 inches apart.

FOR SPOT [SURFACE] TREATMENT:

To Kill Ants, Carpet Beetles, Cockroaches, Crickets, Silverfish, Sowbugs, and Spiders: Spray areas where these insects are found or may hide, including dark corners of rooms and closets; cracks and crevices in walls; along baseboards and door and window frames; behind and beneath sinks, stoves, refrigerators, and cabinets; and around garbage cans, plumbing, and other utility installations. Pests driven out of hiding places should be sprayed directly. For ants, spray ant trails and around doors and windows, and wherever else these pests may find entrance.

To Kill Brown Dog Ticks and Fleas: Thoroughly apply as a spot treatment to infested areas such as pet beds and resting quarters, nearby cracks and crevices, along and behind baseboards, window and door frames, and localized areas of floor and floor coverings, where these pests may be present. Pet's old bedding should be removed and replaced with clean, fresh bedding after treatment. DO NOT SPRAY PETS WITH THIS PRODUCT. Pets should be treated with a registered flea and tick control product prior to reentering treated areas. Also, treat yard with a product registered for yard application.

FOR CRACK AND CREVICE TREATMENT:

To Kill Ants, Brown Dog Ticks, Carpet Beetles, Cockroaches, Crickets, Fleas, Silverfish, Sowbugs, and Spiders: Apply spray in small amounts directly into cracks and crevices. Equipment capable of delivering a pin stream should be used in points between different elements of construction, between equipment and floors, openings leading to voids and hollow spaces in walls, equipment legs and bases where these insects hide.

Care should be taken to avoid depositing the product onto exposed surfaces or introducing the material into the air. Avoid contamination of food or food handling surfaces.

Flies and Mosquitoes: Use only outdoors as an aid in reducing annoyance from these insects. Do not make application during rain. Apply as a spot or crack and crevice spray

to outside surfaces of window and door frames as well as other areas where these pests may enter the home. Also spray dark corners and localized resting areas (such as under eaves) of porches, patios, and garages where these insects may congregate. Flies and mosquitoes coming to rest on treated surfaces will be killed.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

Pesticide Storage: Store in a cool, dry place away from children and pets. Keep container closed.

Pesticide Disposal & Container Handling: Do not puncture or incinerate. If empty – Do not reuse this container. Place in trash or offer for recycling if available. If partly filled – Call your local solid waste agency for disposal instructions. Never place unused product down any indoor or outdoor drain.
