SHAKE CAN WELL BEFORE USING.

This insecticide may be used outdoors in gardens or in greenhouses throughout the growing season or as a pre-harvest treatment when other insecticides are prohibited due to residue restrictions and use limitations.

For best results, use throughout the growing season to prevent buildups of insect infestations. Spray plants from a distance of 1½ to 2 feet using short bursts of 1 second. To prevent injury to plants, avoid visibly wetting the foliage.

Apply in the early morning or late evening when the air is still, treating all foliage with particular attention to the undersides of leaves. Contact insects directly whenever possible. Repeat treatment every 7-10 days or as reinfestation occurs.

USE ON ORNAMENTALS: African violets, asters, azaleas, begonias, camellias, carnations, chrysanthemums, dahlias, dogwood, geraniums, gladioli, marigolds, roses, rubber plants, and wandering Jew.

TO CONTROL: Aphids, flea beetles, leafhoppers, whiteflies, cypselid moth caterpillars and adults, tent caterpillars, and adult Japanese beetles.

USE ON: asparagus, beans, broccoli, cabbage, brussels sprouts, cauliflower, celery, cranberries, cucumbers, melons, squash, eggplants, lettuce, mustard greens, kale, collards, turnips, peppers, potatoes, radishes, spinach, sweet corn and tomatoes.
