### **DIRECTIONS FOR USE**

It is in violation of federal faw to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Mix 1 pound of ALLEY Phly-N-Worm 44 in the daily feed, minerals or salt\*\* of 100 adult cattle to provide the 2 grams Phenothiazine intended.

\*\*Self-feed continuously as the sole source of salt.

Younger cartle: Follow the feeding chart blow to provide ¼ gram Phenothiazine per 100 pounds weight per head daily.

Continuous year round low-level phenothiazine treatment, in conjunction with good hard management practices, will control the specified parasites and will help prevent reinfection.

Consults our veterinarian for assistance in the diagnosis, treatment and control of parasitism-

Cattle should be given access to feed, minerals or salt containing ALLEY Phly-N-Worm 44 for several weeks prior to the appearance of adult horn flies in the spring, and should be fed a ALLEY Phly-N-Worms 44 supplement continuously until flies disappear in the fell. This helps provent the breeding of horn—and face flies but has no affect upon existing adult fly populations. Since horn flies over-winter in—a pupilisetato, all cattle should be sprayed when the flies first appear. Spraying kills the flies emerging from last year's pupae and will protect cattle for about two weeks until the phenothiszne can take effect.

Since face, flies migrate from farm to farm it is essential that the larvicide program be carried out on an area-wide basis to assist in the reduction of the adult face fly population.

## STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

#### Pron-bitions:

Do not contaminate water or food by storage and disposal.

## Pesticide Disposal:

Feed supplements containing Phily-N-Worm 44 which cannot be used should be buried in a safe place caway from water supplies.

## Container Disposal:

Do not reuse empty container. Wrap container and put in trash collection.
