PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS CAUTION

Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through skin. Avoid breathing vapors. Avoid contact with skin. In case of contact, immediately flush skin with plenty of water.

Do not use in commercial food processing or preparation areas. In the home, all food processing surfaces and utensils should be covered during treatment, or thoroughly washed before use. Cover exposed food.

Remove pets, birds, and cover fish aquariums before spraying.

PHYSICAL OR CHEMICAL HAZARDS

Contents under pressure. Keep away from heat, sparks, and open flame. Do not puncture or incinerate container. Exposure to temperatures above 130°F may cause bursting.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

SHAKE WELL BEFORE USE. HOLD CONTAINER UPRIGHT. APPLY IN SHORT BURSTS.

TO KILL FLIES. GNATS. MOSOUITOES AND SMALL FLYING MOTHS: Close all doors and windows and direct spray upward into center of room with slow sweeping motion. Spray 5-10 seconds for average room. Keep room closed for 15 minutes after spraying. Sweep up and destroy fallen insects. Before spraying cover exposed food and utensils.

[TDOORS: Spray area infested with these flying insects. Hold containe. 18-24 inches from shrubs, bushes, and grassy areas. Spray these areas with a slow sweeping motion at a rate of 1 to 3 seconds per cubic yard of space while moving away from the treated area. To reduce annoyance from these pests treat open porches and patio in a similar manner. spray only when the air is still. Allow spray to dissipate before occupying the treated area.

TO KILL ANTS, CENTIPEDES, COCKROACHES, CRICKETS, FIREBRATS, SOWBUGS, AND SPIDERS: Contact as many insects as possible with the spray in addition to thorough spraying of all parts of the room suspected of harboring these pests. Special attention should be paid to cracks, hidden surfaces under sinks, behind stoves and refrigerators, food storage areas, and wherever these pests are suspected of hiding. To kill ants, treat doors, around window frames, ant trails and other areas of entry. Repeat as necessary.

TO KILL CARPET BEETLES: Directly spray as many insects as possible. Spray both interior and exterior of upholstered furniture. Both top and bottom of rugs and carpets should be sprayed thoroughly. Also treat shelves, closets, areas under furniture and wherever these insects are seen or suspected. Repeat as necessary.

TO KILL EXPOSED FORMS OF CONFUSED FLOUR BETTLES. RICE WEEVILS. AND SAW-

The Constitution TOOTHED GRAIN BEETLES: Find and destroy infested package goods. all other items from pantry. Spray the shelves to kill any of the named pests present. Place clean paper on the shelves and return packages after shelves have dried. Repeat as necessary.

TO KILL FLEAS AND TICKS IN PET BEDDING AND PET AREAS: Remove and destroy pet's old bedding. To reduce infestation, thoroughly spray the animal's bedding, sleeping quarters, around baseboards, window and door frames, wall cracks, local areas of floors, and other resting places until the surface is slightly moist. Treat these areas at the rate of two seconds per linear foot at a distance of 12 to 18 inches. Also spray the entire inside surface of dog houses. Repeat as necessary. Put fresh bedding in pet's quarters after spray has dried. DO NOT SPRAY ANIMALS. Also treat dogs and cats with a registered flea and tick control product before allowing them to reenter treated area.

TO TREAT FLEA AND TICK INFESTATION IN RUGS AND CARPETS: Spray rugs and carpets where fleas tend to hide. If used on light or delicate upholstery fabrics, test for potential staining in an inconspicuous place prior to use. Spray thoroughly into hiding places such as cracks or crevices, in walls and floors, along baseboards, window and door frames. Spray at the ate of one square foot per second. Repeat as necessary.

GENERAL: When sprayed directly on insects, this spray will kill the insects listed (Eastern Tent Caterpiller, Aphid, Cankerworm, Leafhopper, White Flies, Spider Mites, Japanese Beetles, Mealybug, Ants, Caterpiller, and Box Elder Bug) on Ornamental Cherry, Spirea, Roses, Crepe Myrtle, Ornamental Crabapple, Andromeda, Azalea, Chrysanthemum, Gardenia, Purple Passion Vine, Peony, Oleander, and Arborvitae. Caution should be taken when spraying tender growth on young plants. WHEN SPRAYING, HOLD CAN 18-20 INCHES FROM PLANT. For best results, spray in the evening or on a cloudy day when air is still. Mist the plants lightly. Use a slow sweeping motion. Avoid wetting foliage with the spray. Spray rows at a rate of 1 foot per second. For heavy growth, spray both sides of row. Repeat as needed. Do not spray when temperature exceeds 90°F.

FOR USE IN USDA INEDIBLE PRODUCT AREAS: This product is acceptable as a sidual pesticide for use in inedible product areas of official establishments operating under the Federal meat, poultry, shell egg grading, and egg products inspection programs. It may be used in edible product areas for crack and crevice treatment provided the pesticide is applied after processing operations have enced, exposed food products and packaging materials are removed or protected, the treated area is ventilated, cleaned thoroughly, and the treated cracks and crevices are sealed before processing operations are resumed. This product must be used in a manner that precludes entry into edible product areas through open windows, ventilating systems, etc.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

STORAGE: Store in a cool, dry area away from heat or open flame.

DISPOSAL: Replace cap and discard container in trash. Do not incinerate or puncture.
