

**PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS
HAZARDS TO HUMANS
AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS
CAUTION**

Harmful if swallowed. May be absorbed through skin. May produce irritation of skin and eyes. Wash thoroughly after handling. Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Wear goggles and a pesticide respirator jointly approved by the Mining Enforcement and Safety Administration (formerly the U.S. Bureau of Mines) and by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health under the provisions of 30 CFR Part 11. Do not breathe dust or spray mist. Avoid contamination of food, feed, seed, and fertilizer.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This product is toxic to fish, birds, and other wildlife. Keep out of lakes, streams, or ponds. Do not apply when weather conditions favor drift from areas treated. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment, or disposal of wastes. Apply this product only as specified on this label.

Do not apply during bloom when honey bees or other pollinators are active. Avoid drift to adjoining food and forage crops or crops in bloom.

"This pesticide is highly toxic to bees exposed to direct treatment or to residues remaining on the treated area. Do not apply when bees are actively visiting the crop, cover crop, or weeds blooming in the treatment area. RE-ENTRY STATEMENT

Do not enter treated areas without protective clothing until sprays have dried. Because certain states may require more restrictive reentry intervals for various crops treated with this product, consult your State Department of Agriculture for further information. Do not apply this product in such a manner as to drift to, or through drift expose workers or other persons. The area being treated must be vacated by unprotected persons.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

PROHIBITIONS: Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal. Open dumping is prohibited. Do not use empty container. Do not store under conditions which might adversely affect the container or its ability to function properly. Such conditions include, but are not limited to, protrusion of the container in storage, storage temperature, pest infestation, crushing or damage due to stacking, and penetration of moisture.

STORAGE: Store in safe manner. Store in original container only. Store in cool, dry place. Reduce stacking height where local conditions, such as humidity or pest overhang, can affect package strength. Personnel should use caution and equipment listed under PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENT when handling open containers.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Pesticide wastes are toxic. Proper disposal of excess pesticide spray material must be in accordance with Federal Law. USE PRECAUTIONS

Do not apply on feed or forage crops to be fed to dairy animals. Aerial application of lindane is prohibited.

Do not apply to crops in rotation with root crops, or use in soils that are to be planted with these crops since off flavor will result. Consult your State Agricultural Experiment Station for additional information as the timing may vary with local conditions.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

Pour recommended amount of this material through screen on surface of water in nearly filled spray tank, or pre-mix in a bucket half filled with water and pour into nearly filled spray tank. Add balance of water to fill tank. Keep agitator running during filling, mixing, and spraying operations. Do not allow mixture to stand. Do not use in low volume gear type spray equipment. Do not combine wettable powders with emulsifiable liquids in the same spray tank unless previous use of the materials being combined has proved them to be physically compatible.

PEAR & APPLE: Aphids—Use 1 1/4 to 3 1/2 lbs. in 100 gals. water. May be used as late as petal fall at the 2 lb. dosage for the control of Rosy Apple Aphids. Do not apply more than 12 1/2 lbs. per acre application. Do not apply within 60 days of harvest, or after the fruit starts to form.

PEACH: Plum Curculio—Use 1 1/2 to 2 lbs. in 100 gals. water. Do not apply more than 8 lbs. per acre application. Make first application when half of shucks have fallen, second application when all of shucks have fallen, and third application about 7 days later. Do not use within 60 days of harvest on peaches.

STRAWBERRIES: Spittle Bugs, Strawberry Weevils—Use 1/2 to 1 lb. in 100 gals. of water. Do not apply more than 16 lbs. per acre application. Do not apply after the edible parts start to form.

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), is acceptable provided that you make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

1. Add the appropriate label statements about providing written and oral warnings to farmworkers.
2. Change "Active Ingredients" to "Active Ingredient" since there is only one.
3. Add "It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling" directly beneath the heading Directions For Use.
4. Correct the spelling of "persists" in the "If in eyes" advice.
5. Delete the quotation marks around the bee precaution paragraph. Quotation marks appearing in Agency letters are merely to show the exact recommended text and are not to appear on the finished labels.
6. Delete "For Agricultural Use Only." The Restricted Use Pesticide block supersedes this use limitation.
7. Revise the respirator advice to reflect the current names of the regulating agencies:

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Your pesticide respirator is jointly approved by MSHA (Mine Safety and Health Administration) and NIOSH (National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health) under the provisions of 30 CFR Part 11.

Submit five (5) copies of your revised final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment with the amended labeling.

A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

If you hold a Federal registration, a supplemental registration, or a Special Local Needs registration, you may continue to produce new stocks of such products, using current labeling, until ~~July 30~~^{July 31} 1984. After that date, all remaining inventories of affected products will fall under the Existing Stock provisions stated in our letter of October 20, 1983.

The product registration record has been amended to show the change in product name to Clean Crop Linane 12-9.
