- 2) delete "For terrestrial uses" from the Environmental Hazards since only terrestrial uses are listed on the label.

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STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

PESTICIDE STORAGE: Keep out of reach of children and animals. Store in original containers only. Store in a cool, dry place and avoid excess heat. Carefully open containers. After partial use, replace lids and close tightly. Do not put concentrate or dilute material into food or drink containers. PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Metal: Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other procedures approved by state and local authorities. Do not cut or weld metal containers. **Plastic:** Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or incineration, or, if allowed by state and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.

DIRECTIONS FOR MIXING: Use only in equipment with mechanical or paddle agitation. Be sure spray tank is clean. With enough water in tank to cover agitator shaft, add desired amount of this material to the tank with agitator in motion. Pump this mixture through the overflow and back into tank for about two minutes. If this mixture turns white, it indicates good emulsification. Fill the tank with water, adding other desired materials as tank is filling. Keep agitator running at all times.

Do not use if material does not emulsify. Do not use in undiluted form.

Apply the following recommended rates in sufficient water to thoroughly cover one acre. With ground application equipment on Apples and Pears use a minimum of 300 gallons; on stone fruits and nuts use a minimum of 200 gallons; on grapes for cane pruned vines use a minimum of 200 gallons, for cordon pruned or arbor trained vines use a minimum of 300 gallons of diluted spray per acre. When using concentrate spray equipment use a minimum of 60 to 90 gallons of diluted spray per acre.

Do not apply this product through any type of irrigation system.

APPLES AND PEARS: San Jose Scale, Oyster Shell Scale, Brown Apricot Scale, Black Scale and aid in control of European Red Mite—Use 3 to 4 gallons per 100 gallons of water (Concentrate spray 6 to 8 gallons per acre); or 2 to 3 gallons of DORMANT QUIK-MIX HEAVY in combination with 6 to 7 pounds of Polysulphide Compound or 5 to 6 gallons of Lime Sulphur Solution per 100 gallons of water. (Concentrate spray use 6 to 8 gallons of DORMANT QUIK-MIX HEAVY plus 6 gallons of Lime Sulphur Solution per acre).—Apply in the dormant period.

APRICOTS, CHERRIES, NECTARINES, PEACHES AND ALMONDS: San Jose Scale, Oyster Shell Scale, Brown Apricot Scale, Black Scale and aid in control of European Red Mite—Use 3 gallons per 100 gallons of water (Concentrate spray use 6 gallons per acre). Apply in the fall, dormant, or delayed dormant period.

As An Adhesive: For sticking copper on Apricots, Cherries, Nectarines, Peaches, Prunes and Almonds—Use 1½ to 2 gallons per 100 gallons of water. Apply in the fall, dormant, or delayed dormant periods.

OLIVES: As an Adhesive: For sticking copper use 2 gallons per 100 gallons of water. Apply at post-harvest and before new growth appears.

PRUNES: San Jose Scale, Oyster Shell Scale, Brown Apricot Scale and aid in control of European Red Mite Eggs—Use 3 gallons of DORMANT QUIK-MIX HEAVY in combination with 6 to 7 pounds Polysulphide Compound or 5 to 6 gallons of Lime Sulphur Solution per 100 gallons of water. (Concentrate spray use 6 gallons of DORMANT QUIK-MIX HEAVY plus 6 gallons of Lime Sulphur Solution per acre.) Apply in the dormant or delayed dormant periods. (Sacramento and Suisan Valley areas: Application preferred in pre-bloom when fruit buds show green tips). Certain varieties of prunes may be injured by oil sprays; check tolerance to oil prior to treatment.

GRAPES: Grape Mealybug—Use 4 gallons per acre in 200 to 400 gallons of spray combined with an insecticide approved for use with a spray oil on grapes. Apply in the dormant period. Observe the warning directions on the insecticide label approved for use on grapes. Do not combine this mixture with sodium arsenite.

WALNUTS: Frosted Scale, European Fruit Lecanium Scale, Calico Scale and aid in control of European Red Mite—Use 3 gallons per 100 gallons of water. Apply in the delayed dormant period. This treatment should only be used on trees that have not suffered from lack of moisture at anytime during the growing season. Further, oil should not be applied to orchards when soil moisture is low.
