### PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS HAZARDS TO HUMANS & DOMESTIC ANIMALS

## DANGER

Causes irreversible eye damage. Harmful if swallowed or inhaled. May cause allergic skin reactions. Do not get in eyes. Avoid contact with skin and clothing.

### STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

If in eyes: Flush with plenty of water. Get medical attention.

If swallowed: Call physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Drink promptly a large quantity of milk, egg whites, gelatin solutions, or if these are not available, drink large quantities of water. Avoid alcohol. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

If inhaled: Remove victim to fresh air. If not breathing give artificial respiration, preferably mouth-to-mouth. Get medical attention.

If on skin: Wash with plenty of soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

### ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This pesticide is toxic to fish. Do not apply directly to water or wetlands (streams, bogs, marshes, and pot holes). Drift and runoff from treated areas may be hazardous to aquatic organisms. In the growing areas. Do not contaminate wells by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes.

### DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Do not apply the product in such a manner as to directly or through drift expose worker or other persons who are being treated shall be vacated by unprotected persons.

Wear goggles or face shield when handling. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Remove contaminated clothing and separately launder clothing before reuse. Launder soakers when mixing and loading the product must wear a long-sleeved shirt and long pants or a coverall that covers all parts of the body except the head, hands and feet. Wear chemical resistant gloves, goggles or a face shield and a chemically resistant apron. A dust mask must be worn when mixing and loading this product. Fieldworkers and handlers must wear chemical resistant gloves. Leather or fabric gloves are not acceptable.

AFTER WORK: Take off all clothes and shoes. Shower using soap and water. Do not wear contaminated clothing. Wash protective clothing and equipment with soap and water after each use. Personal clothing worn during use must be laundered separately from household articles. Clothing and protective equipment must be decontaminated or treated with captan prior to being discarded according to state and local regulations.

During application only, from a tractor with a completely enclosed cab or from an airship with an enclosed cockpit a long-sleeved shirt and long-legged pants must be worn. Chemically resistant gloves must be available in the cab or cockpit and worn while exiting.

### RE-ENTRY TIME

Do not allow persons to enter the treated area within 4 days following application unless a long-sleeved shirt and long pants or a coverall that covers all parts of the body except the head, hands and feet and chemically resistant gloves are worn. Consultively post ready information at site of application. Because certain states may require more restrictive reentry intervals for various crops treated with this product, consult your State Department of Agriculture for further information.

Written or oral warnings must be given to workers who are expected to be in a treated area or in an area about to be treated with this product. Inform workers of areas of hazard that may not be entered in their specific protective clothing, period of time field must be vacated and appropriate actions to take in case of accidental exposure. When oral warnings are given, warnings shall be given in a language customarily understood by workers. Oral warnings must be given in there is relation to believe that written warnings cannot be understood by workers. Written or oral warnings must include the following information:

### DANGER

And treated with Captan (read label). Do not allow persons to enter treated areas within 4 days following application unless a long-sleeved shirt and long pants or a coverall that covers all parts of the body except the head, hands and feet and chemically resistant gloves are worn (from State Department of Agriculture reentry interval, more restrictive).

In case of accidental exposure to persons (body or dust), wash the skin thoroughly with soap and water. Remove contaminated clothing and wash before reuse if it is dry. Brush off plenty of water. Call a physician. If inhaled, remove victim to fresh air. If not breathing give artificial respiration, preferably mouth to mouth. Get medical attention.

### STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

PESTICIDE STORAGE: Not for use or storage in or around the house. Keep out of reach of children and animals. Store in original containers only. Store in a cool, dry place and avoid excess heat. Carefully open containers. After partial use, lid and not back bags, clamp and close tightly. Do not pour contents of old material into hood or drum containers. Do not contaminate other pesticides, fertilizers, water, tools, or feed by storage or disposal.

In case of spill, avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. If dry material, cover to prevent dispersal. Place damaged package in a holding container identified.

SPILLS

To contain spill if liquid, dike surrounding area or absorb with sand, cat litter or commercial clay. If dry material, cover to prevent dispersal. Place damaged package in a holding container identified.

### Storage and Disposal Continued

**PESTICIDE DISPOSAL:** Pesticides are not generally hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticides, spray residue, or waste is a Violation of Federal Law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by methods according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance.

**CONTAINER DISPOSAL:** Completely empty bag prior to application to prevent theft. Then dispose of empty bags in a sanitary landfill or by incineration, or as allowed by State and local authorities by burning if burned, stay out of smoke.

Apply to give thorough coverage to upper and lower leaf surfaces. May be applied by ground or air. Observe days interval between application and harvest indicated by number in ( ) following crop.

Almonds (12): Brown Rot, Shot Hole, Scale, Leaf Blight—Use 25 to 50 pounds per acre. Apply at bloom, bloom, petal fall stages and up to 5 weeks after petal fall. When applied after petal fall, do not lead almonds to dairy animals or animals being fattened for slaughter.

Apples (10): Apple Scab—Use 20 to 80 pounds per acre. Apply in prebloom, blossom, petal fall, and first cover periods. For secondary infection use 10 to 25 pounds per acre and apply in cover periods. Brooks Frt. Spot, Flyspeck—Use 11 to 37½ pounds per acre and apply in cover periods. Black Rot, Black Rot, Botryosphaeria—Use 20 to 37½ pounds per acre. Apply in late cover and preharvest periods.

Apricots (10): Brown Rot, Jester Rot—Use 50 pounds per acre. Apply at red bud stage and repeat at 75 percent petal fall.

Cherries (10): Cherry Leaf Spot—Use 33 to 40 pounds per acre. Apply in pinks, full bloom, petal fall and first cover periods. Brown Rot—Use 11 to 50 pounds per acre. Apply in pinks, full bloom, petal fall, shrub, and cover periods.

Grapes (10): Botrytis Rot (Bunch Rot)—Use 40 to 50 pounds per acre. Apply twice before bloom, and once just after bloom. Repeat periodically to make 3 cover applications before bunches close. Apply to every row and direct spray toward the clusters. To be effective, dust must be applied before rain. Whenever rain threatens apply an additional dust. Applications made following rain will have been of very little benefit if conducted at 50% RH. Ground application equipment is preferred.

Oranges: Mold control for fruit on drying trees in Florida—Penicillium spp., Aspergillus spp., Botryotinia cinerea, Rhizopus spp.—Use 10 pounds per acre. Apply to fruit in trays for protection of fruit and prevention of above molds. Apply to give even coverage. During damp weather make a second application when trays are returned. Apply this dust by hand or ground dusters only. Do not apply within 3 days of a planned harvest application of captan.

Peaches (10), Plums (10): Brown Rot, Peach Scallop—Use 50 pounds per acre. Make 2 to 3 prebloom applications. Repeat at petal fall making 3 to 4 cover sprays as necessary. Make permanent application where necessary.

Pears (10): Pear Scallop (except Pacific Northwest)—Use 20 to 30 pounds per acre. Make first application during early flower and petal fall stages. Repeat applications for each infection period or at weekly intervals as long as necessary. Raisening may be produced on Bold Pears. Do not use on D'Anjou Pears.

Plums (10), Peaches (10): Brown Rot—Use 20 to 50 pounds per acre. Apply at red bud and 75 percent bloom, full bloom, petal fall and in cover spray as necessary. Thorough coverage is essential for maximum control.

Strawberries (10): Botrytis Rot—Use 20 to 40 pounds per acre. Make first application when new growth starts in spring before fruit begins to form. Repeat applications weekly. Severe infection conditions: Continue spraying through harvest periods, treating fruit daily until each picking.

Cantaloupes (10), Cucumbers (10): Downy Mildew, Angular Leaf Spot, Anthracnose—Use 20 to 25 pounds per acre on young plants. Increase to 30 to 50 pounds per acre on mature plants. Apply at first sign of disease. Repeat at 5 to 7 day intervals until danger of infection is past.

Potatoes (10): Seed Rot and Damping-Off—Dust at 75% power, per bushel cut seed pieces (12 cts. or 1/4 pound cut seed pieces). Apply in convenient container or by duster attachment over cut. Cut pieces should be treated within 8 hours of cutting. If planting is to be delayed more than 1 to 2 days the treated cut pieces should be stored for 2 days in open crates before bagging.

Tomatoes: Early Blight, Late Blight, Anthracnose, Septoria Leaf Spot—Young Plants—use 25 to 30 pounds per acre. Mature Plants—Use 35 to 50 pounds per acre. Begin applications at first sign of disease. Repeat at 5 to 7 day intervals.

Oxenpecker: Rose—Black Spot, Camellias—Rust and Leaf Spot—Chrysanthemums—Flower Blight—Use 25 to 30 pounds per acre. Apply at first sign of disease to give even coverage of upper and lower leaf surfaces. Repeat at 7 to 10 day intervals as necessary.

Birds and Greenhouse Bench Treatment: Pre-planting for Damping-Off and Root Rot Diseases on Seedling or Transplants of Roots (and other shrubs and trees), many Flowers and Lawns—Seedbeds—Use 1½ to 2 pounds per 1000 square feet (50 to 60 pounds per acre). Water into upper 3 to 4 inches of soil before planting.

Only the applicator is permitted to be in the greenhouse during application of captan. Open vents to greenhouse during application and for at least 1 hour after application.

Workers planting in captan-treated soil must wear chemical resistant gloves.

Stock: Botrytis Rot—Use 40 to 50 pounds per acre. Apply when blossoms appear. Repeat at weekly intervals as needed.

Turf and Lawns: Brown Patch, Leaf Spot, Damping-Off, Root Rot—Use 1 to 2 pounds per 1000 square feet. Begin treatment before infection occurs. Repeat at 7 to 10 day intervals throughout summer. Do not graze treated areas. Do not feed clippings to livestock.
