PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS  
HAZARDS TO HUMANS & DOMESTIC ANIMALS

DANGER

Cause irritation to eye damage. Harmful if inhaled or swallowed. May cause allergic skin reactions. Do not get in eyes. Avoid contact with skin and clothing.

### STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

If in eyes: Flush with plenty of water. Call a physician.  
If swallowed: Call physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Drink promptly a large quantity of milk, egg white, plain solution, or if these are not available, drink large quantities of water. Avoid alcohol. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.  
If inhaled: Remove victim to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration, preferably mouth-to-mouth. Get medical attention.  
If on skin: Wash with plenty of soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

### ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

The pesticide is toxic to fish. Do not apply directly to water or wetlands (swamps, bogs, marshes, and ponds). Dirt and silt from treated areas may be hazardous to aquatic organisms in neighboring areas. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes.

### DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. Do not apply the product in such a manner as to directly or through drift expose humans or other persons. The area being treated must be vacated by unexposed persons. Wear goggles or face shields when handling. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Remove contaminated clothing and separately launder clothing before reuse. Manufacturers when mixing and loading the product must wear a long-sleeved shirt and long pants or a coverall that covers all parts of the body except the head, hands and feet. Wear chemical resistant gloves, goggles or a face shield and a chemically resistant apron. A dust mask must be worn when mixing and loading the product. Farmworkers and harvesters must wear chemical resistant gloves. Leather or fabric gloves are not acceptable. During application only from a tractor with a completely enclosed cab or from an aircraft with an enclosed cockpit or a long-sleeved shirt and long legged pants must be worn. Chemically resistant gloves must be available in the cab or cockpit and worn while sitting.

**AFTER WORK:** Take off all clothes and shoes. Shower using soap and water. Do not wear contaminated clothing. Wash protective clothing and equipment with soap and water after each use. Personal clothing worn during use must be laundered separately from household articles. Clothing and protective equipment heavily contaminated or drenched with captan must be destroyed according to state and local regulations.

### RE-ENTRY STATEMENT

Do not allow persons to enter treated areas within 4 days following application unless a long-sleeved shirt and long pants or a coverall that covers all parts of the body except the head, hands and feet and chemically resistant gloves are worn. Contemporaneously post reentry information at site of application. Because certain states may require more restrictive re-entry intervals for various crops treated with this product, consult your State Department of Agriculture for further information.

Written or oral warnings must be given to women who are suspected to be in a treated area or in an area about to be treated with this product. Inform women of area or fields that may still be entered without specific protective clothing, period of time field must be vacated and appropriate actions to take in case of accidental exposure. When oral warnings are given, warnings shall be given in a language customarily understood by workers. Oral warnings must be given if there is reason to believe that written information cannot be understood by workers. Written or oral warnings must include the following information:

### DANGER

Area treated with Captan 80 WDG on (insert date). Do not allow persons to enter treated areas within 4 days following application unless a long-sleeved shirt and long pants or a coverall that covers all parts of the body except the head, hands and feet and chemically resistant gloves are worn (insert State Department of Agriculture's re-entry interval, if more restrictive). In case of accidental exposure to pesticide spray or dust, wash the skin thoroughly with soap and water. Remove contaminated clothing and wash before reuse. If in eyes, flush with plenty of water. Call a physician. If inhaled, remove victim to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration, preferably mouth-to-mouth. Get medical attention.

### STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

**PESTICIDE STORAGE:** Not for use or storage in or around the house. Keep out of reach of children and animals. Store in original containers only. Store in a cool, dry place and avoid excessive heat. Close tightly upon containers. After partial use, lock and seal back bags, clamp and close tightly. Do not put concentrate or dilute material into food or drink containers. Do not contaminate other pesticides, fertilizers, water, food, or feed by storage or disposal. In case of spill, avoid contact with areas and keep out animals and unprotected persons. Confine spills.  
To confine spill: If liquid, dike a surrounding area or absorb with sand, cat litter or commercial clay. If dry material, cover to prevent dispersal. Place damaged package in a holding container. Identify container.

### Storage and Disposal Continued

**PESTICIDE DISPOSAL:** Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or waste is a violation of Federal Law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency for the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance.  
**CONTAINER DISPOSAL:** Completely empty bags into application equipment. Treat a space of empty bag in a sanitary landfill or by incineration, or if allowed by State and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.

Do not treat areas while unprotected humans or domestic animals are present in the treatment area. Do not apply this product through any type of irrigation system.

Mixing Instructions: Fill the spray tank one fourth to one third full with clean water. Start agitation (propagation) creates a rapping or rolling action on the liquid surface. Add Captan 80 at the recommended rate. Stir thoroughly. Add water to fill spray tank. Maintain sufficient agitation during mixing and spraying operations to ensure a uniform spray mixture.

Note: For correct sprayer applications, the same quantity (per acre) of CAPTAN 80 WDG, as would be normally applied when spraying dilute mixture, should be applied to each acre in sufficient water for coverage.

Except as specified, begin applications before or at the first sign of disease. Repeat applications as necessary to maintain control but observe use limitations. With the exception of orchard crops, use the lower rate on small young plants with low disease potential. Use the higher rate on larger (or mature) plants with a high disease potential as a moisture to severe. For orchard crops, use the higher rate as a disease preventer increases.

Almonds: Brown Rot, Shot Hole, Scab (Leaf Blight)—1½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray. Apply at popcorn, bloom, petal fall stages and up to 5 weeks after petal fall. May be used up to 12 days of harvest if buds are not fed to dairy animals or animals being finished for slaughter.

Apples: Primary Scab Infection—1½ lbs. per 100 gals. per 100 gals. spray. Apply at 7 day intervals as needed, to maintain control in prebloom, bloom, petal fall and leaf cover sprays. Secondary Apple Scab, Brown Fruit Spot, Flyspeck, Bitter Rot, Black Rot, Botrytis, Black Pod, U.S.'s Eye Rot, Botrytis Rot—¾ to 1½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray at 10 to 14 day intervals in second and later cover sprays up to start of harvest.

CAPTAN 80 WDG should not be used in combination with or closely following or in alternation with wettable sulfur products on sulfur sensitive varieties of apples such as Red Delicious, Staygreen, Baldwin, King, etc., as severe foliage injury and defoliation may occur.

Foliage injury may at times occur in Red Delicious, Winesap and other sensitive varieties of apples in early season sprays.

Apricots: Brown Rot (Tag Blight), Jactal Rot—1½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray. Apply at red bud stage, bloom, and repeat at 75 percent petal fall.

Cantaloupes, Cucumbers: Anthracnose, Downy Mildew—1½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray or apply 2½ lbs. per acre in water to cover. Apply at first sign of disease. Repeat at 5 to 7 day intervals or as necessary.

Cherries: Cherry Leaf Spot (West Only), Brown Rot, Botrytis Rot—1½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray. Spray at prebloom, bloom, petal fall.

Grapes: Downy Mildew, Black Rot—1½ lbs. in 100 gals. spray. Apply just before bloom, repeat immediately after bloom. Depending upon susceptibility of grape variety, from 1 to 3 sprays may be needed at 7 to 10 day intervals. Dead Arm Disease (Northeast)—1½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray. Make first application when new growth is 4" to 6" long, repeat when growth is 8" to 10" long.

Peaches, Nectarines: Brown Rot, Scab, Coryneum (Shot Hole)—1½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray. Apply at pink bud, full bloom and petal fall stages. Repeat at 10 to 14 day intervals after petal fall. Also make late fall applications for Coryneum Blight.

Pears: Pear Scab (Except Pacific Northwest)—Primary Infection—1½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray. Apply during early finger stage and petal fall stage. Secondary infection—¾ to 1½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray during cover spray. Severe Scab Infection—1½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray. Additional treatments may be necessary. Rusting may be produced on Bosc Pears. Do not use on D'Anjou Pears.

Plums, Pluots: Brown Rot—1½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray. Apply at Green Tip or popcorn stage. Repeat at bloom and 75% petal fall stages. Also repeat later in season as necessary. Prune Rust Scab (Lacy Scab in California)—1½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray (8" to 10" per inch). Apply at full bloom.

Strawberries: Botrytis Rot—1½ to 2 lbs. per 100 gals. spray (200 diluted gals. per acre or equivalent to 2½ to 3½ lbs. per acre in water to cover). Apply when new growth starts in spring before first starts to form. Repeat weekly. Severe Infection—Continue through harvest period, treating immediately after each picking.

Tomatoes: Early Blight, Late Blight, Gray Leaf Spot, Anthracnose, Septoria Leaf Spot—1½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray or apply 2½ to 3½ lbs. per acre in water to cover. Severe Infection—2½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray or apply 3½ to 5 lbs. per acre in water to cover. Apply at first sign of disease. Repeat at 5 to 7 day intervals or as necessary to keep diseases under control.

Turf, Lawn: Brown Patch, Leaf Spot, Damp-off, Root Rot—1½ lbs. per 100 gals. spray. Apply 10 gals. to each 1000 sq. ft. of turf or apply 5 lbs. per acre in water for coverage. Apply prior to infestation. Repeat at 7 to 10 day intervals as necessary. Do not graze treated areas or feed clippings to livestock.

Do not apply under conditions involving possible drift to food, forage or other plantings that might be damaged or the crops thereof rendered unfit for sale, use or consumption.

Compatibility: CAPTAN 80 WDG may be combined with most commonly used insecticides, adjuvants and fungicides with the exception of strongly alkaline materials such as hydrated lime, which reduces the fungicidal activity. Do not use this product in combination with sprays or with such formulations of fireproof products. Do not use this product on foliage closely following of sprays. Observe all cautions and limitations on labeling of all products used in mixtures.
