The labeling cited above and submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is accepted subject to the comments reflected on the enclosed sheet. A copy of your proposed labeling stamped "ACCEPTED WITH COMMENTS" is enclosed.

WHAT THIS ACCEPTANCE MEANS:

Based on your certification, the Agency has accepted the labeling changes that are necessary to comply with the Worker Protection Standard (WPS) labeling requirements of 40 CFR part 156, subpart K, described in PR Notices 93-7 and 93-11. Any other labeling changes submitted in connection with this amendment application but not directly related to compliance with the WPS have not been reviewed or accepted by the Agency. If you wish to make such changes, you must submit a separate amendment application proposing them. If your product is currently suspended, the acceptance of this labeling amendment does not affect the suspension in any way.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO NEXT:

By the next label printing make all the specified changes to your labeling. Send to EPA one (1) copy of the final printed labeling:

- BEFORE selling or distributing any product bearing the final printed labeling
- AND
- WITHIN one year from date of this acceptance.



IF IN EYES: Flush with water for 15 minutes.
IF INHALED: Remove exposed person to fresh air.
NOTE TO PHYSICIAN: Carbaryl insecticide is a moderate, reversible, cholinesterase inhibitor. Atropine is antidotal.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This product is extremely toxic to aquatic and estuarine invertebrates. For terrestrial uses, do not apply directly to water, or to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Do not apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons, either directly or through drift. Only protected handlers may be in the area during application.
For any requirements specific to your State or Tribe, consult the agency responsible for pesticide regulation.

Subsequent planting of food and feed crops in treated soils must be made with crops on this or other carbaryl labels.

AGRICULTURAL USE REQUIREMENTS

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard, 40 CFR part 170. This Standard contains requirements for the protection of agricultural workers on farms, forests, nurseries, and greenhouses, and handlers of agricultural pesticides. It contains requirements for training, decontamination, notification, and emergency assistance. It also contains specific instructions and explanations relating to the statements on this label about personal protective equipment (PPE), and restricted-entry interval. The requirements in this box only apply to uses of this product that are covered by the Worker Protection Standard.

Do not enter or allow worker entry into treated area during the restricted entry interval (REI) of 12 hours.

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Broadcast application may be made by ground equipment or aircraft. Treatments may be repeated as necessary. Apply recommended dosage for control of cutworms, armyworms, crickets, darkling ground beetles, grasshoppers and sow bugs.

For band application, reduce rates proportionately.

Alfalfa: Apply 30 lbs. per acre. Do not apply within 7 days of harvest.

Asparagus, Strawberries: Apply 40 lbs. per acre. Do not apply within 1 day of harvest.

Beans, Carrots, Corn, Eggplant, Okra, Peppers, Potatoes, Tomatoes, Sweet Corn: Apply 40 lbs. per acre. Do not apply after 3 days of harvest.

Broccoli, Brussels Sprouts, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Head Lettuce, Garden Beets (roots), Horseradish, Parsnips, Radishes, Rutabagas, Turnips (roots): Apply 40 lbs. per acre. Do not apply within 3 days of harvest.

Cotton: Apply 30 to 40 lbs. per acre. Do not apply within 7 days of harvest.

Cucumbers, Squash, Melons, Peanuts: Apply 20 lbs. per acre. No time limitation.

Peas: Apply 30 lbs. per acre. Do not apply within 3 days of harvest.

Safflower: (seedling stage only). Apply 30-40 lbs. per acre. No time limitation.

Sorghum: Apply 30 to 40 lbs. per acre. Do not apply within 21 days of harvest if used for grain. No time limitation if sorghum is used for forage.

Sunflowers: (Seedling stage only). Apply 30-40 lbs. per acre. Do not apply within 60 days of harvest.

Sugar Beets, Collards, Endive (escarole), Garden Beets (tops), Kale, Leaf Lettuce, Parsley, Spinach, Swiss Chard, Turnips (tops): Apply 40 lbs. per acre. Do not apply within 14 days of harvest.

FRUIT AND NUT TREES

Apples, Cherries, Pears, Peaches, Plums, Prunes: To control grasshoppers and earwigs apply 40 lbs. per acre. Two applications can be made per year. Do not apply within 1 day of harvest.

Almonds: To control grasshoppers and earwigs apply 40 lbs. per acre. Two applications can be made per year. Do not apply within 28 days of harvest.

Pecans, Walnuts: To control grasshoppers and earwigs apply 40 lbs. per acre. Two applications can be made per year. No time limitation.

Citrus: To control grasshoppers and earwigs apply 40 lbs. per acre. Two applications can be made per year. Do not apply within 5 days of harvest.

Nectarines: To control grasshoppers and earwigs apply 40 lbs. per acre. Two applications can be made per year. Do not apply within 3 days of harvest.
