This product contains a highly paraffinic carefully refined white oil plus' selected emulsifiers.

GENERAL INFORMATION ''

This oil mixes readily with water and is to be used as a dormant or delayed dormant spray for the control of certain inserts for Ind on deciduous shade trees, ornamental shrubs, and as a dormant to pre-pink spray on certain fruit trees. It may be used on evergreens, taking into consideration the Plant Response Precautions noted elsewhere on this label.

PLANT RESPONSE PRECAUTIONS

Do not apply this product or any other oil spray when the temperature is

below 40°F, or at any time when there are indications that it may fall to freezing or below within 24 hours after spraying.

Keep container tightly closed in storage to prevent entry of water.

Do not exceed maximum rates or apply later than recommended. Spring dormant spraying is advised as it is safer and more effective. Spraying in late winter or too early in the spring is about as hazardous as fall spraying. It is best to wait until winter is definitely over (as close as possible to actual start of bud growth in the spring.)

Do not use on sugar (hard) maples, beech, hickory, walnut, and butternut. Most conifers (evergreens) are susceptible to oil injury; therefore, special caution should be exercised when oil sprays are used. When evergreens are exposed to heavy spray drift or run-off spray from other trees, protect with coverings until spraying and drip are over, or wash evergreens with clear water immediately after such exposure.

Do not use sulfur compounds or Captan, with or near time of application of this product. Allow at least a 7 to 10 day interval between sprays of sulfur, Captan, and this product.

MIXING DIRECTIONS

- 1. Start sprayer pump and agitator.
- 2. Start filling sprayer tank with water.
- 3. Add this product before water covers agitator blades.
- If other pesticides are to be combined with the oil, add as tank is being filled with agitator running.

 5. Complete filling sprayer tank with water, keeping agitator running.

SPRAY METHODS

The dosage rates specified are for conventional hydraulic spraying. This product can also be used in mist blowers or concentrate sprayers. Do not apply this product through any type of irrigation system.

DECIDUOUS SHADE TREES

Use 3 gals. of this oil in 97 gals. of water as a dormant spray to control San Jose Scale, European Fruit Lecanium, European Elm Scale, European Red Mite, Oyster Shell Scale, Scurfy Scale, Putnam Scale, Terrapin Scale, and Euonymus Scale.

Use 4 gals, in 96 gals, of water to control Cottony Maple Scale. See section on Plant Response Precautions.

EVERGREENS

Use 2 gals. of this oil in 98 gals. of water for control of scale insects, Red Mite, Spruce Gall Aphid, Pine Bark Aphid, and other similar insects on evergreens. Apply with fine mist spay in the spring just before the new
