DIRECTIONS

ALLADDIN ALGICIDE PELLETS are used to control algae and fungal and bacterial slime in recirculating industrial cooling waters. Badly fouled systems must be cleaned before treatment is begun. Begin treatment when the system is in danger of becoming affected or after cleaning systems whose efficiency is already impaired. An initial slug of 6-12 ounces of ALLADDIN ALGICIDE PELLETS per 1000 gallons of water to provide 40-80 parts per million of active ingredients based on the total weight of water in the system is recommended. Repeat until control is achieved.

Subsequent slug additions of 3-6 ounces of ALLADDIN ALGICIDE PELLETS per 1000 gallons of water (20-40 parts per million of active ingredients) should be employed every 2-5 days or as needed. Frequency of addition depends upon the severity of the microbiological problem and the relative amount of bleed-off. Slug additions should be made in the sump of water cooling towers.

FIRST AID: In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. For eyes, call a physician. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before re-use.
