We have received the enclosed letter from New York State dated November 21, 2006, regarding the subject product. Our label contains required ground water advisory statements and numerous statements intended for the protection of ground water. The label specifically contains the statement, "Do not apply SpraKil SK-13 within areas identified by state and local authorities as protected ground water recharge zones." The State of New York has identified Long Island as a protected ground water recharge zone. Accordingly, they are requiring that we amend our label to include the statement, "This product cannot be sold, distributed or used in Nassau and Suffolk Counties, New York."

Re: Concerns Regarding the Registration of <u>Tebuthiuron</u> Containing Products in New York State

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (Department) has received inquiries regarding the registration of tebuthiuron containing products in New York State. Currently, your company has one tebuthiuron containing product, <u>SpraKil SK-13</u> <u>Granular Weed Killer</u> (EPA Reg. No. 34913-15), registered in New York State.

According to the United States Environmental Protection Agency's (USEPA's) Reregistration Eligibility Decision (RED) document, "tebuthiuron is persistent and mobile and can leach to ground water, as indicated by a small-scale retrospective ground water study. It is resistant to biological and chemical degradation, and its principle route of dissipation in the environment appears to be mobility. Transport to ground water through leaching and to surface water through run-off are likely as a result of tebuthiuron's persistence and low adsorption to soil."

The SpraKil SK-13 Granular Weed Killer label contains ground water advisory statements and numerous statements intended for the protection of ground water. The product also contains the following statement: "Do not apply SpraKil SK-13 within areas identified by state and local authorities as protected ground water recharge zones."

Since Long Island consists mainly of permeable soils over a shallow water table which is considered a sole source drinking water aquifer, it is considered a protected groundwater recharge zone. Therefore, your tebuthiuron product cannot be legally used on Long Island.

The Department must take a proactive approach to protect this precious drinking water source.

Therefore, you must submit updated product labeling which clearly states that the product cannot be sold, distributed or used in Nassau and Suffolk Counties, New York. Updated labeling must be received before the registration of these products can be renewed.

If SSI Maxim Company, Inc. chooses not to clarify the label in regard to use on Long Island, the Department will not renew the registration of this product and it will be cancelled as of March 31, 2007.

Please be aware that any unregistered product may not be sold, offered for sale, distributed, or used in New York State.

Also, to insure that your product will be used in strict accordance with label directions, the product will be re-classified as "restricted use" in New York State. This restriction is in accordance with 6NYCRR Part 326.23(e) and will take effect as of January 1, 2007.

Please be reminded products classified as "restricted use" in New York State are restricted in their purchase, distribution, sale, use, and possession in New York State.

Also, according to New York State Department of Environmental Conservation Regulations 6NYCRR 326.3(a): "It shall be unlawful for any person to distribute, sell, offer for sale, purchase for the purpose of resale, or possess for the purpose of resale, any restricted pesticide unless said person shall have applied for, and been issued a commercial permit."

Should you require information to obtain a commercial permit, please contact the Pesticide Reporting & Certification Section, at (518) 402-8748.

In addition, the Pesticide Reporting Law (PRL) in the Environmental Conservation Law Article 33 Title 12 requires all certified commercial pesticide applicators to report information annually to the Department regarding each pesticide application they make. Commercial pesticide retailers are required to report all sales of restricted pesticide products and sales of general use pesticide products to private applicators for use in agricultural crop production. If no sales are made within New York State, a report still must be filed with the Department indicating this is the case.

NON-CROP WEED CONTROL INDUSTRIAL USE ONLY

SpraKil SK-13 Granular is a nonselective herbicide for controlling a wide range of annual and perennial weeds and grasses, it is recommended only for non-cropland areas such as railroad rights-of-way, under paved surfaces, and industrial areas. 150 to 400 pound applications of SpraKil SK-13 Granular per acre usually result in a nonproductive condition of the soil for a period of a year or more. The duration of nonproductivity is dependent upon rainfall, soil type, and other conditions.

SpraKil SK-13 Granular should be applied as furnished with a seed spreader, a fertilizer spreader, a shaker type applicator, or with any equipment which will distribute the chemical uniformly over the area to be treated. For the control of annual and most perennial weeds and grasses, apply SpraKil SK-13 Granular at the rate of 150 to 400 pounds per acre; on smaller plots, 0.35 to 1.0 pound per 100 square feet. Repeat spot treatment may be required when deep-rooted perennial weeds are present. To obtain the best results, SpraKil SK-13 Granular should be applied to the ground where it will be absorbed by the roots. Applications made early in the season have been found to give results superior to applications at a later seasonal date. SpraKil SK-13 Granular may, however, be applied at any time of the year except when the ground is frozen. Maximum effectiveness in arid regions is obtained when application is made just prior to the rainy season. For control of undesirable weeds under paved surfaces, SpraKll SK-13 Granular can be used under asphalt and other paved areas in industrial sites or where the pavement has a suitable barrier along the perimeter that

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARD

GROUND WATER ADVISORY

This product is known to leach through soil into ground water under certain conditions as a result of registered (rangeland and non-crop) uses. Use of this product in areas where soils have rapid to very rapid permeability, particularly where the water table is shallow, may result in ground water contamination.

Use Restrictions for Ground Water Protection Vulnerable Sites: To minimize any movement of tebuthiuron to subsurface water, do not exceed the application rates specified below on treatment sites where soils have a sand or loamy sand texture throughout the soil profile and all of the following characteristics:

- I. Rapid to very rapid permeability.
- 2. Absence of well-defined organic layers or a textural B-horizon (restricting layer of fine-textured soil).
- 3. The water table of an underlying aquifor is shallow.

An equifer is defined as an "underground saturated, permeable geologic formation capable of producing significant quantities of water to a well or spring". It is the ability of the saturated zone, or portion of that zone, to yield water which makes it an aquifer (American Chemical Society, 1983). Local agricultural agencies can provide further information on the type of soil in your area and the location of shallow ground water aquifers.

Do not apply SpraKit SK-13 in areas where the water table is predominately shallow (5 feet or less), such as marshy or sub irrigated areas, or areas immediately adjacent to streams or lakes which are periodically flooded, unless such use is allowed under a state-approved pesticide management program. Note: Also on such areas, woody plants rooted directly in a shallow water table are minimally affected by applications of tebuthjuron, and poor woody plant control will result.

Do not apply SpraKli SK-13 within areas identified by state or local authorities as protected ground water recharge zones.

For vegetation control by broadcast (ground equipment) and banded applications;

The maximum label rate and frequency of application is 200 lbs. SpraKil SK-13/acre once every three years for

vulnerable areas (where soils are sandy and depth to water table is shallow). For all other areas, SpraKil SK-13 may be applied one time in a 3-year period at rates up to 400 lbs./acre; however, no more than 600 lbs./acre may be applied in two consecutive treatments in any 6-year period.

Spot treatments (hand-held equipment): Spra'Kil SK-13 may be applied at rates up to the equivalency of 400 lbs./acre when needed.
