The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under FIFRA sec. 3(c)(7)(A), is acceptable, subject to the following provisions:

1. Submit and/or cite all data required for registration/reregistration of your product under FIFRA sec. 3(c)(5) when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.
2. The Confidential Statement of Formula (CSF) dated February 11, 1992, is now the basic formulation and supersedes all previous CSFs submitted for this product. However, the Agency is requiring that APHIS revise their CSF to list the weight of the empty capsule, which we consider a component of the formulation. Therefore, within 90 days, you are also required to submit a revised CSF to conform to that of APHIS. You may wish contact Stephen Palmateer of USDA/APHIS at (301) 436-7175 to obtain the weight of the empty capsule.
3. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling submitted February 7, 1992:
 - a. You reversed the EPA Est. No. and the EPA Reg. No. on the draft labels. Correct this error when you print the labels.
 - b. Net weight of the capsules should be listed as 48.5 grams.
