This dosage is equivalent to 5 ppm available chlorine by weight.</p> <p>For Pool Maintenance: A. Adjust pool water pH to 7.6 - 8.0 range and maintain. B. Add manually or by a feeder device this sodium hypochlorite solution at stated maintenance available chlorine residual of at least 1.0 ppm. One (1) pint (16 fl. oz.) of this sodium hypochlorite solution for each 4000 gallons of water is equivalent to 1.0 ppm available chlorine by weight. Frequently add to maintain 0.6 to 1.0 ppm available chlorine will depend on temperature and number of swimmers. Use test kit to take reading. See side panel for individual area in the proper range.</p> <p>DIRECTIONS FOR DISINFECTION OF POTABLE WATER FOR HOME WELL WATER SYSTEMS Dilute this sodium hypochlorite solution in the ratio of one part sodium hypochlorite solution to 11 parts softener free water. Mix sodium hypochlorite solution and water thoroughly and feed feeding of solution with a hypochlorinator dosing pump. Maintain a free available chlorine residual of at least 0.2 ppm and no more than 0.6 ppm throughout the distribution system as determined by a DPD chlorine test kit. Bacteriological sampling must be conducted at a frequency no less than that prescribed by the National Interim Primary Drinking Water Regulations. Check water frequently with a DPD chlorine test kit. Contact your local Health Department for further details.</p> <p>DIRECTIONS FOR SANITIZING FOOD PROCESSING OR DAIRY EQUIPMENT Clean equipment in the normal manner. Just before using, treat all surfaces thoroughly with this sodium hypochlorite solution containing 200 ppm available chlorine. Maintain contact with disinfectant for a minimum of two minutes. Do not reuse with water after treatment with sodium hypochlorite solution. Do not soak overnight. Add one (1) pint (16 fl. oz.) of this sodium hypochlorite solution per 10 gallons of water will provide approximately 200 ppm available chlorine by weight.</p> <p>NOTE: This product degrades with age. Use a chlorine test kit and re-test dosage as necessary to obtain the required level of available chlorine.</p> <p>STORAGE AND DISPOSAL: Store in a cool, dry area away from direct sunlight. In case of spill, flood area with large quantities of water. Rinse empty container thoroughly with water and either return to manufacturer or discard by placing in trash collection or burying in an approved landfill. Product or rinsate that cannot be used should be diluted with water and disposed of in a sanitary sewer. Do not contaminate food or feed by storage, disposal or cleaning of equipment.</p>
