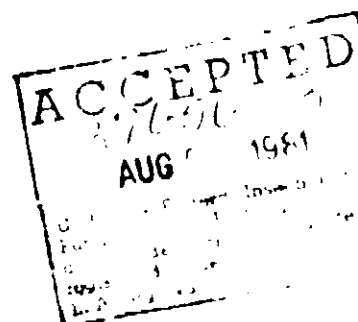




(Chlorinating Solution)

ACTIVE INGREDIENT
SODIUM HYPOCHLORITE 5%
INERT INGREDIENTS 95%

KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN

GENERAL CLASSIFICATION

This classification of federal law is used in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

DIRECTIONS FOR SWIMMING POOL CHLORINATION

For a new pool or for spring start-up, superchlorinate with 1.5 lb (15 fl. oz.) of 5% sodium hypochlorite per 10,000 gal. of water. Retest water. This dosage is equivalent to 5 ppm free chlorine by weight.

FOR POOL MAINTENANCE

A: Adjust pH as recommended. B: Add 1 lb of 5% sodium hypochlorite per 10,000 gal. of water to maintain a free chlorine residual of 0.5 to 1.0 ppm. One gallon of 5% sodium hypochlorite solution contains 500,000 grains of available chlorine. 1.0 ppm available chlorine by weight. Frequency of application to maintain 0.5 to 1.0 ppm available chlorine will depend on temperature and number of swimmers. Retest water. Maintain the pH of the pool water at 7.2 and maintain.

NOTE: In hot weather, use more chlorine and increase dosage as necessary to obtain the required free chlorine.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL: Store in original container away from direct sunlight. Use of 10,000 gal. area with significant loss of water. Rinse empty container thoroughly with water and return to manufacturer or discard by placing in trash collection or bury in an approved land disposal unit. Residual chlorine should be diluted with water and disposed of in a sanitary manner. Do not contaminate food or feed material storage, disposal, or equipment.

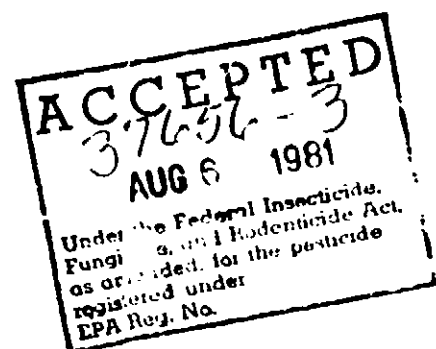

DIRECTIONS FOR SWIMMING POOL CHLORINATION

For a new pool or for spring start-up, superchlorinate with one (1) pint (16 flu. ozs.) of sodium hypochlorite solution for each 2500 gallons of water. This dosage is equivalent to 5 ppm available chlorine by weight.

FOR POOL MAINTENANCE

A) Adjust pool water pH to 7.6 - 7.2 range and maintain.
B) Add manually or by a feeder device, sodium hypochlorite solution at a rate to maintain an available chlorine residual of 0.5 to 1.0 ppm. One half pint (8 flu. ozs.) of sodium hypochlorite solution for each 6000 gallons of water will provide 1.0 ppm available chlorine by weight. Frequency of additions to maintain 0.5 to 1.0 ppm available chlorine will depend on temperature and number of swimmers. Use test kit to make certain the pH and chlorine residual are in the proper range.

NOTE: This product degrades with age. Use a chlorine test kit and increase dosage, as necessary, to obtain the required level of available chlorine.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL: Store in a cool, dry area away from direct sunlight. In case of spill, flood area with large quantities of water. Rinse empty container thoroughly with water and either return to manufacturer or discard by placing in trash collection or burying in an approved land fill. Product or residue that cannot be used, should be diluted with water and disposed of in a sanitary sewer. Do not contaminate food or feed by storage, disposal or cleaning or equipment.
