For a new pool or for spring start-up, superchlorinate with one (1) pint (16.9 ozs) of sodium hypochlorite solution for each 2500 gallons of water. This dosage is equivalent to 5 ppm available chlorine by weight.

FOR POOL MAINTENANCE:

- (A) Adjust pool water pH to 7.6 - 7.7 range and maintain.
- (B) Add manually or by a feeder device, sodium hypochlorite solution at a rate to maintain an available chlorine residual of 0.6 to 1.0 ppm. One half pint (8 fl. ozs) of sodium hypochlorite solution for each 6000 gallons of water will provide 1.0 ppm available chlorine by weight. Frequency of additions to maintain 0.6 to 1.0 ppm available chlorine will depend on temperature and number of swimmers. Use test kit to make certain the pH and chlorine residual are in the proper range.
