WHAT THIS ACCEPTANCE MEANS:

Based on your certification, the Agency has accepted the labeling changes that are necessary to comply with the Worker Protection Standard (WPS) labeling requirements of 40 CFR part 156, subpart K, described in PR Notices 93-7 and 93-11. Any other labeling changes submitted in connection with this amendment application but not directly related to compliance with the WPS have not been reviewed or accepted by the Agency. If you wish to make such changes, you must submit a separate amendment application proposing them. If your product is currently suspended, the acceptance of this labeling amendment does not affect the suspension in any way.

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

AGRICULTURAL USE REQUIREMENTS

This standard contains requirements for the protection of agricultural workers on farms, forests, nurseries, and greenhouses, and handlers of agricultural pesticides. It contains requirements for training, decontamination, notification, and emergency assistance. It also contains specific instructions and exceptions pertaining to the statements on this label about personal protective equipment (PPE), notification to workers, and restricted-entry interval. CROP INFORMATION

CITRUS - Citrus Thrips:

Air Application - Use 6-10 pounds per acre in 10-25 gallons of water. Add 8-18 pounds of sugar per acre as bait. Fly every row. Screen size should be 20 mesh or larger.

Ground Application - Use 6-10 pounds per acre in 20 to 100 gallons of water. Add 11-18 pounds sugar per acre as bait. Screen size should be 20 mesh or larger.

APPLES, PEARS - Codling Moth:

Use 8-19 pounds in 100 gallons water. Apply at 10 to 14 day intervals as required, with first application at petal fall. For later infestations, apply at 10 to 14 day intervals as required. Spray thoroughly to give complete coverage. Screen size should be 20 mesh or larger.

CORN - European Corn Borer:

NOT FOR USE IN CALIFORNIA

Use 30 to 40 pounds per acre as a dust. Apply at 5 day intervals as necessary, beginning when borers start hatching or feeding. Screen size should be 20 mesh or larger.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

PROHIBITIONS

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.
Do not reuse empty container.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL

Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL

Completely empty bag into application equipment, then dispose of empty bag in a sanitary landfill or by incineration, or if allowed by state and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.
