FIRST AID

Dosage rate: Interior 5,000 to 10,000 ppm of finished product Exterior 10,000 to 25,000 ppm of finished product

Plasters and Stucco: PREVENTOL® A 26-D is used for dry-film preservation of plasters and stucco. The exact amount for the preservation of any given formulation will depend on the components, storage time, temperature, etc., and can be determined by actual testing based on formula weight.

Dosage rate: 3,000-15,000 ppm of finished product

Sealants, Caulks, and Fillers:

Preventol® A 26-D is used for dry-film preservation of sealants, caulks, and fillers. The exact amount for the preservation of any given formulation will depend on the components, storage time, temperature, etc., and can be determined by actual testing based on formula weight.
